"Khan Al-Shih Camp Showered with Internationally Prohibited Firebombs"



- Resident of Khan Dannun Camp killed in ongoing hostilities
- Deraa Camp hit with anti-ground missiles and heavy weapons
- Palestinians of Syria rent shelters at up to \$150 in Syria and 400\$ in Turkey and Lebanon per single month
- Aid packages delivered to Palestinian refugee families in southern Syria

Victims

Youngster Mahmoud Fathi Saleh, sheltered in Khan Dannun Camp for Palestinian refugees, was killed while fighting alongside the Syrian regime forces in bloody hostilities with the opposition outfits, most probably in Khan Al-Shih, in Damascus western outskirts.

Mahmoud is the second casualty documented in the past 72 hours among the residents of Khan Dannun Camp. Other refugees taking shelter in the camp sustained critical wounds in the ongoing clashes.

Recently, a meeting between representatives of the Palestine Liberation Army (PLA), pro-regime Palestinian outfits, National Defense Committees, and delegates of the Iranian Revolutionary Guard Corps culminated in a decision to dispatch military reinforcement to the Dierkhabiya front after a number of Syrian regime fighters were announced dead.

Latest Developments

The Russian fighter aircrafts at predawn time on Sunday hit the Khan Al-Shih Camp for Palestinian refugees in Western Al-Ghouta with internationally banned firebombs. Wildfires rocked civilian homes in Nastala Street, resulting in heavy material losses.

Reporting from the scene, AGPS news correspondent said a warplane slammed four explosive barrels containing the internationally prohibited and flammable napalm liquid into the environs of Khan Al-Shih Camp. At the same time, artillery shelling targeted the central neighborhoods of the



camp and its main water reservoir, inflicting remarkable material damage.



Over recent weeks, Khan Al-Shih Camp and its adjacent ranches have been subjected to heavy blitzing by the Russian warplanes using phosphorus incendiary grenades and cluster bombs. Offensives on local schools, mosques, and on the Al-Alsalam Hospital took away the lives of a number of civilians, including women and children, and wreaked havoc on civilian homes.

AGPS reporter has also sounded alarm bells over the tragic humanitarian situation in the camp after refugees had run out of food, bread, and water due to the tough blockade imposed by the regime militias for 38 days running.

In a related development, the Syria regime troops stationed in Deraa showered residential neighborhoods in Deraa Camp, Deraa Al-Balad, and Al-Sadd Road, with randomly-discharged spates of anti-ground missiles and heavy machinegun fire.



Residents of Deraa Camp have been grappling with appalling living conditions due to the frequent water outages. Unabated warfare reduced 70% of civilian homes in the camp to rubble.

Several Palestinian refugees in Syria have been forced out of their shelters due to the deadly offensives, the blockade, and forced deportation.

The situation of the Palestinian refugees who fled their embattled camps has gone far worse due to the steep monthly rental fees estimated at up to \$150 in Damascus rural and urban areas, where monthly income does not exceed \$100, in the best of cases. Rental costs in Lebanon and Turkey have gone up as high as \$400, forcing hundreds of homeless and unemployed refugees to live rough.



Civil Action Committees

The Palestine Charity Commission in southern Syria handed out aid packages to the Palestinian refugees who have been displaced from Deraa and taking shelter in Al-Muzeireeb and other beleaguered areas.



Some 300 displaced families received stoves, firewood, and winter blankets.

The move makes part of the so-called “Winter Warmth” project launched by the commission in cooperation with Al-Saraa Charity to tone down the calamitous state of affairs in Palestinian refugee camps in beset Syria.



Palestinians of Syria: November 06, 2016 Statistics:

- *There are 15,500 Palestinian-Syrian refugees in Jordan.*
- *42,500 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are in Lebanon.*
- *6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt, according to UNRWA figures covering the period from July 2015 backwards.*
- *8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.*
- *1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees reside in the blockaded Gaza Strip.*
- *Over 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.*
- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General*

Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,237 days in a row. Electricity and water supplies have been cut off, respectively, for 1,295 days and 757 days. The number of those killed due to the blockade has hit 190.

- *Sbiena refugee camp: Refugees could not go back to their homes as a result of the blockade slapped by the Syrian regime forces since 1,090 days running.*
- *Handarat refugee camp: All refugees left the camp since 1,282 days after opposition outfits grabbed hold of the area.*
- *Deraa refugee camp: Water has been cut off for 940 consecutive days while 70% of its buildings have been knocked down.*
- *Homs camp, Hama camp, Jaramana camp, al-Sayda Zeinab camp, Al-Raml camp: A of State of relative calm has been reported in the abovementioned areas. However, economic crises have been on the rise.*
- *Khan al-Shih refugee camp: All access roads out of and into the camp have been closed off by the Syrian regime army for 37 days running.*
