Latest Developments

Syrian regime forces and Russian squads have entered Deraa Camp for Palestinian refugees through AlSaraya crossing in Deraa AlBalad, south of Syria.

The forces inspected the residents' identity documents in search of wanted opposition affiliates.

Syrian army troops entered Deraa al Balad, the birthplace of the uprising against President Bashar al-Assad's rule, for the first time since it lost control over the area a decade ago, residents.

Army units set up at least nine checkpoints across the city under a Russian-brokered deal between the army and opposition groups that was finally agreed this week. Previous ones had faltered over disagreements over the extent of army control in the area and disarming rebels.

In 2018, Assad's army, aided by Russian air power and Iranian-backed militias, retook southern Syria, bordering Jordan and the Israeli-occupied Golan Heights to the west.

In another development, UNRWA said nearly 50,000 Palestine refugee students returned to its schools in Syria on September 5, 2021.

Deputy-Director of UNRWA's Syria operations visited UNRWA schools in Hums and took down note of the students' impressions



and aspirations. He further stressed the need to abide by safety protocols, including distancing and hand-washing.

Along similar lines, Palestinian refugees in Yalda have denounced the poor-quality education services provided to their children in the area.

Speaking with AGPS, a number of parents said their children have not received school furniture yet and a number of classrooms have been left without teachers.

Several UNRWA facilities were destroyed in the Syrian warfare and others have gone out of operation, including two clinics, a vocational training center, a youth development center, and 28 schools, out of 112 UNRWA schools in Syria.

Meanwhile, Palestinian and Syrian refugees sheltered in the displacement camps of AlMuhammadiya and Deir Ballout, north of Syria, joined a vigil held in solidarity with the residents of Deraa city and its Palestinian refugee camp.

The rally-goers chanted slogans condemning the mass expulsion of civilians from the area and calling on the United Nations and international human rights bodies to take urgent action in response to the human rights abuses perpetrated by the Syrian regime and its Russian abettor.

In the meantime, the body of Palestinian refugee from Syria Mahmoud Fahmi Ass'ad was found by the German police at the refugee's house in Zweibrucken city, in Rheinland-Pfalz district.



His relative said he had suddenly lost contact with him before police told him on Monday that he was found dead at his house.

A few days earlier, he was reported missing by his friends. Investigations have been underway to determine the death cause.

Fahmi had sought shelter in AlAyedeen Camp for Palestinian refugees, in Hums, before he fled to Germany.
