## **Latest Developments**

Sources close to the Palestine Liberation Army (PLA), affiliated with the Syrian government forces, mourned the death of its staff member Palestinian refugee Ahmad Suleiman who died while in a mission in Syria.

AGPS found out that 278 Palestinian refugees fighting alongside PLA forces were pronounced dead since the outbreak of the conflict in the Syrian Arab Republic.

Scores of Palestinian youths have been forced to join the PLA. Those who refuse forced conscription are often subjected to manhunt and imprisonment. Thousands of young men have fled the country in the hunt for a safer shelter.



Sometime earlier, the PLA's Chief of Staff, Major General Tareq AlKhadra, said nearly 6,000 conscripts have been fighting alongside PLA at over 15 sites across war-ravaged Syria.

In another development, Palestinian refugee Maher Khaled Mahmoud, born on April 21, 1994 and raised in AlHajar AlAswad in Syria, has gone missing for the fourth year running after he was



kidnapped by pro-government forces at Ali AlWahsh Street checkpoint, in Rif Dimashq, in March 2013.

His family continues to appeal for information over his mysterious condition and whereabouts.



AGPS kept record of the incarceration of 1,768 Palestinian refugees in Syrian state prisons, among them 108 women and girls.

Along the same line, the Syrian security forces freed on Thursday, November 7, Palestinian refugee Issa Amayri, who was arrested in April, along with a number of refugees displaced from Yalda, south of Damascus, after they were summoned to questioning by the local reconciliation committees at the Palestine Branch.

Meanwhile, UNRWA said the third batch of the 2019 cash aids for the Palestinians of Syria will be delivered as of November 11.

Texts messages specifying the time and location of the delivery will be sent to the refugees.



Aids will be handed over to Palestinian families worst affected by the conflict. Families with a female, elderly (aged above 60), or minor (below 18) breadwinner and families with a person with disability will benefit from the allotted aids.

Concerned families are required to show up at the nearest aid distribution center to check their personal data.
