Latest Developments

An agreement has been struck between the opposition outfits south of Damascus to secure a humanitarian passageway between Yarmouk Camp and Yalda town.

Key to the agreement is to allow civilians a safe access out of and into the area from 07:00 a.m. to 07:00 p.m. The deal also stipulates that civil defense ambulances safely enter/exit the area to evacuate emergency cases.



In a related development, ISIS has been gearing up to close off areas controlled by its militias near Tahrir AlSham-led zones west of Yarmouk Camp.

ISIS gunmen ordered the residents not to enter foodstuff to the area so as to tighten the noose around the neck of Tahrir AlSham fighters and force them to throw in the towel.

Meanwhile, the family of the Palestinian refugee Jumu'a Mohamed Eid, a resident of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, appealed to the human rights



institutions to urgently work on disclosing the fate of their relative, who has gone missing for three years and a half.

In a letter emailed to AGPS, the family said their relative was taking shelter in Deir Yassin Street, in Yarmouk Camp for Palestinian refugees, south of Damascus, when he has gone missing. His fate has been shrouded in mystery so far.

According to AGPS data, over 300 Palestinian refugees have gone missing since the outbreak of the Syrian warfare, 38 among whom identified as female refugees. Over half of the missing Palestinians are residents of Yarmouk Camp.

In the meantime, AGPS kept record of the death of 19 Palestinian refugees in July 2017, down from 27 in July 2016.

As for the geographical distribution of the July 2017 casualties, Rif Dimashq topped the list with 10 victims, followed by three in Hama, one in Daraa, one in AlRiqa, and another in Aleppo. A Palestinian also died in Damascus while two more others died in unknown locations.





As for the victims of July 2016, AGPS kept record of the death of 10 Palestinians in Rif Dimashq, six in Aleppo, three in Daraa, two in Damascus, and two others in the southern Lebanese city of Sidon. Five more Palestinians died in unidentified locations across the ravaged Syrian territories.

Palestinians of Syria: August 09, 2017 Statistics:

- *At least 3,553 Palestinians, including 463 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*
- *1,622 Palestinian refugees, including 102 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*
- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,475 days in a row.*
- *196 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.*
- *Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,214 and 1,063 days.*
- *Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,557 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 310 days.*
- *Nearly 85,000 Palestinian refugees from Syria fled to Europe until the end of 2016.*
- *31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.*
- *17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.*
