Latest Developments

The United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestinian Refugees in Near East (UNRWA) said it has been facing a severe financial crisis and strives to preserve aids for Palestinians from Syria in Lebanon.

In response to a letter sent by the Association of Displaced Palestinians from Syria in Lebanon, the UN refugee agency said it has been striving to garner additional funds to continue its core essential services for Palestine refugees.



The Association of Displaced Palestinians from Syria in Lebanon said on Facebook that a few days earlier it sent a letter to UNRWA demanding that the agency shell out urgent cash aids for Palestinian refugees who fled war-torn Syria to Lebanon.

Lebanon's recent protest wave has swelled socio-economic anxieties among the Palestinians of Syria, who have been denied access to vital services and to the local labor market.



Nearly 28,000 Palestinians from Syria have sought refuge in Lebanon, where they have been shorn of their basic rights and facing high rates of unemployment and poverty.

In another development, AGPS identified the names of three Palestinian refugees who died under torture in Syrian state-run prisons over October.



Fadi Fuad AlSoutari, from Yarmouk Camp, along with Sa'id Mustafa Amrein and Ziad Lutfi Amrein. They had been secretly detained for years, before they were pronounced dead.

According to AGPS data, some 611 Palestinian refugees were tortured to death in Syria's state run lock-ups.

In the meantime, Palestinian refugee Dhiaa AlDeen Ahmed Saleh AlSbeihi, a former opposition gunman, was fatally shot by anonymous gunmen on Friday November 8 in AlMuzeireeb town, in Daraa's western suburbs.

An AGPS field reporter said gunmen boarding an armored car opened fire at the victim while he was outside of his home in AlMuzeireeb before they run away. He died immediately.



Over recent years, several assassination attempts have targeted Palestinian refugees in the area.

AGPS documented the death of dozens of Palestinian refugees in AlMuzeireeb town, home to 1,700 Palestinian families displaced from Daraa Camp.



Along the same line, five Palestinians have been enduring mysterious fates in Syrian state run prisons, four among whom identified as members of the Daoud family.

The four family members are: Nour Ahmad Daoud, born in 1987, a resident of AlHajar AlAswad area, and the father of a young girl. He was kidnapped in 2013; Daoud Ahmad Daoud, born in 1986, a resident of AlHajar AlAswad, and the father of two boys and a girl. He was kidnapped at the AlBatikha checkpoint.

The list also includes the two brothers Mahmoud Mohamed Kheir Daoud, born in 1996, and Ali Mohamed Kheir Daoud, born in 1998. Both are residents of AlHajar AlAswad and were kidnapped in 2014 from AlDweilaa area, in Damascus.



Palestinian young man Mustafa Marwan Husain, born in 1989 and a resident of Misraba, was kidnapped in 2013 from the UNRWAled vocational education center in AlMezzeh, in Damascus.
