## **Latest Developments**

A Palestinian family who was displaced from Yarmouk Camp, in Damascus, to the southern Lebanese city of Sur has appealed to the international humanitarian institutions to take urgent action in order to save their eight-day-old newborn.

The family said their toddler suffers from a hemorrhage caused by a circumcision surgery (the removal of the foreskin from the human penis) he underwent in Sur last Sunday.

The newborn needs a needle that costs \$800, a sum that far exceeds the family's ability to shell it out.



Nearly 28,000 Palestinian refugees from Syria have sought shelter in Lebanon, where they have been subjected to a precarious legal status and dire socio-economic conditions owing to their lack of access to vital services, particularly health care.

In another development, 124 Palestinian refugees taking shelter in AlHusainiya Camp in Rif Dimashq have been pronounced dead in war-torn Syria, according to AGPS database.



The list includes 73 Palestinians who died under shelling, 12 who were tortured to death in Syrian detention centers, 33 who were fatally gunned down, four who were shot by snipers, and three others who were executed.



Over 3,900 Palestinian refugees, including hundreds of women and children, have been pronounced dead in the embattled Syrian territories.

Meanwhile, Palestinian refugee Mohamed Ibrahim Ibrahim, called Abu Nasser, has been secretly held in Syrian government prisons for the fourth consecutive year.





Mohamed, born on January 1, 1982, was arrested at a checkpoint in Street 30, in Yarmouk Camp, on February 18, 2012.

His condition and whereabouts could not be identified.

AGPS has documented the secret incarceration of 1,768 Palestinian refugees in Syrian government dungeons, among them 108 women and girls.

In the meantime, Palestinians taking shelter in AlAyedeen Camp in Hums have been facing a deteriorating humanitarian situation as a result of the price leap, sharp shortage in fuel supplies, the frequent power blackouts, and absence of humanitarian assistance.

Most residents depend on relief aids sporadically handed over to them by UNRWA.

High rates of unemployment and the security turmoil rocking the region have made the situation far more alarming in the camp.

Pro-government forces have reportedly tightened military grip around the main entrances to the camp and cracked down on civilians' free movement.
