Latest Developments

The Turkish Association for Solidarity with Palestine (FIDAR) in cooperation with the Popular Conference for Palestinians Abroad opened up a vocational training centre for Palestinian refugees in Esenyrut, in the Turkish metropolitan city of Istanbul.

The centre will provide practical training to young Palestine refugees. It seeks to equip them with the relevant skills and expertise for Middle Eastern labour markets.

A range of specializations at different levels, are covered, such as language learning, secretariat, mobile and computer maintenance, and accessories design.

In another development, Palestinian refugees from Syria denounced cash aid delivery through Lebanon Post, saying several mistakes have occurred.

The cash-stripped refugees also said distribution offices are so distant from their houses and shelters, adding that they have been made to line up for hours outside of bank offices.

A refugee said Lebanese nationals are served by five bank staffers while only one staffer delivers cash to Palestinian refugees.

Meanwhile, representatives of the General Authority for Palestinian Arab Refugees (GAPAR) paid a visit to Handarat Camp, north of Syria.



GAPAR chief Ali Mustafa promised to work on advancing the rehabilitation the camp and reconstructing destroyed premises.

He said, however, in order for reconstruction to see the day, funds should be raised by donor parties.

In the meantime, CSOs in AlNeirab Camp, in Aleppo, called on UNRWA to deliver cash aid to the eligible families on a monthly basis.

In written demands, the residents urged GAPAR and UNRWA to work on resuming delivery of food aid every month to all concerned families due to the dire economic condition and loss of livelihoods in Syria.

In the meantime, a maintenance project has been launched by a CSO in Jaramana Camp for Palestinian refugees, in Rif Dimashq, to repair the submersible pump of the water tank that feeds about half of the population in the area.

Maintenance staffers have also repaired an underground water network.

At the same time, the local committee in AlSayeda Zeinab Camp for Palestinian refugees has repaired the power generator of the main water tank.
