Latest Developments

Thousands of Palestinians from Syria have spent the holy occasion of Eid AlAdhha (Feast of Sacrifice) away from their homes and families.

Happy childhood memories for Palestinian children from Syria have ended when one or both of their parents were killed in the warfare.

Torn from the nourishment of home and warmth of family, Palestinians have been scattered across several destinations and striving for livelihoods to feed their starved children and retrieve their smiles.

Hundreds of families have become internally displaced across and outside of the Syrian territories.

Instead of being a time of joy, the arrival of Eid AlIdha, the holiday marking the beginning of the sacred pillar of Islam –AlHajj (Greater Pilgrimage), is a sad reminder for many Palestinian children of what they have lost.

In a place where neither vital facilities nor leisure amenities are made available, the advent of Eid meant that dozens of displaced Palestinian and Syrian families spend the occasion in their poorlyequipped shelters.



In another development, Palestinian refugee Mohamed Issa Falaha, born in 1984, has gone missing since July 15 after he left Deraa Camp, south of Syria.

His family continues to appeal for information about his condition and whereabouts.

333 Palestinian refugees from Syria, including 37 women and girls, have gone missing since the outbreak of the Syrian warfare, AGPS has found out.

Most of those who have disappeared in the country are residents of Yarmouk Camp for Palestinian refugees, south of Damascus.

Meanwhile, Director of UNRWA operations in Syria Amanya Michael Ibye met with Damascus governor on July 14 during a visit paid to Deraa, south of Syria.

Amanya updated the governor on UNRWA's plans to rehabilitate its destroyed premises in Deraa Camp and enhance services for Palestinian refugees.

The governor hailed UNRWA's reconstruction initiatives and called for boosting education services for Palestine refugees. He pledged to take all measures in order to support the Agency.

Sometime earlier, on behalf of the UNRWA Commissioner-General, Amanya honored Ihab Daoud, the environmental health worker in Deraa, in recognition of his efforts during the COVID-19 pandemic.



Along similar lines, UNRWA is seeking an analyst programmer, a project associate, a psychosocial counselor, technical instructors, an engineer, a trade instructor, and an electrician for its Syria office.

The Agency invites applications through inspira.un.org. The deadline is July 31, 2021.

UNRWA is a United Nations agency established by the General Assembly in 1949 and mandated to provide assistance and protection to some 5.7 million Palestine refugees registered with UNRWA across its five fields of operation.
