"Palestinian Refugee Families Facing Squalid Humanitarian Condition in Syria's AlBal Camp"

- 248 Palestinian Residents of Khan Eshieh Camp Fall Prey to Enforced Disappearance in Syrian Jails
- Palestinian Refugee Muawiya AlFout Secretly Jailed in Syria for 7th Year
- Cash Aid Delivered to Palestinians from Syria in Lebanon



Latest Developments

Some 25 displaced Palestinian families taking refuge in ramshackle and poorly-equipped tents set up in AlBal Camp for Palestinian refugees in Aleppo's northern outskirts, north of Syria, continue to launch cries for help over their alarming humanitarian condition.

The families have sounded distress signals over the dire situation they have been facing owing to the absence of vital services, relief assistance, heating equipment, and power and water. The camp is located several kilometers away from the city center.

The displaced Palestinian families have appealed to UNRWA and the concerned humanitarian organizations to make urgent steps in order to alleviate their suffering.



Located north of Suran city, in the northern countryside of Aleppo, AlBal Camp was established in April 2018 to give shelter to families displaced from Eastern AlGhouta. It is home to nearly 600 makeshift tents funded by AFAD charity and the Turkish Red Crescent.



The rampant Syrian warfare has had disastrous fallouts on the Palestinian refugees, hundreds of whom have been struggling for survival in the violence-stricken country.

In another development, some 248 Palestinian residents of Khan Eshieh Camp, in Syria's Rif Dimashq province, among them women and children, have been secretly held in Syrian government jails.

The detainees' fates and whereabouts have been shrouded in mystery.

AGPS documented the death of 616 Palestinian refugees under torture in state-run prisons in Syria.

Along similar lines, Palestinian refugee Muawiya AlFout, aged 36, has been secretly detained in Syria's state run lock-ups for the seventh consecutive year.

Muawiya was kidnapped by Syrian government forces on September 20, 2013 at a checkpoint set up near AlSabina, in Damascus. He was transferred to an unknown location.





Conflicting reports have emerged on his prison term. His condition and whereabouts could not be identified. His family continues to appeal for information about his fate and location.

AGPS urges the Syrian authorities to reveal the fate of Palestinian detainees held in its penitentiaries.

Meanwhile, UNRWA has transferred cash aids for the Palestinians of Syria in Lebanon via ATM cards.

Every Palestinian family from Syria received a rental allowance of 150,000 Lebanese pounds and a food allowance worth 40,000 LP per every refugee.

Nearly 28,000 Palestinian refugees from Syria seeking shelter in Lebanon have been subjected to dire socio-economic conditions and a precarious legal status as the Lebanese authorities continue to rebuff their appeals for legal visas and access to the local labor market.
