Latest Developments

Palestinian refugee Reham Abu Rashed has won a grant from a British university after she garnered high scores at the University of Southern Denmark, specializing in Mechatronics Engineering. The Nuclear Research Center CERN in Switzerland also approved her request for trainings at its research centers.

Reham fled Yarmouk Camp for Palestinian refugees, in war-torn Syria, to Denmark with her family, seeking better opportunities. She managed to master the Danish language and integrate into the Danish society. She obtained the highest score in her specialty.

In another development, residents of Khan Eshieh Camp for Palestinian refugees, in Rif Dimashq, embarked on a campaign to raise awareness about Palestinian refugees who have fallen prey to fatal torture and enforced disappearance in Syria's penal complexes.

The move comes after activists in Syria launched a campaign under the hashtag #WeWantThePrisoners to urge the Syrian regime to release all prisoners.

Over 150 Palestinian residents of Khan Eshieh Camp, among them women and children, have been secretly held in Syrian regime prisons. The detainees' fates and whereabouts have been shrouded in mystery.



AGPS has also documented the death of 30 Palestinian refugees from Khan Eshieh Camp under torture in state-run prisons in Syria.

Meanwhile, 497 students who graduated from the Damascus Training Centre (DTC) were honored by the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees (UNRWA) in a ceremony held between December 13-14, 2021 and January 11, 2022.

Director of UNRWA operations in Syria, Michael Amanya, and his deputy, Prafulla Mishra, acclaimed the strong determination of Palestinian refugees and their commitment to make their dreams come true.

Director-General of the General Authority for Palestinian Arab Refugees (GAPAR), Kasem Husain, said thousands of Palestinian refugees have graduated from the Damascus Training Centre (DTC).

UNRWA has been able to provide vocational training opportunities for thousands of Palestine refugees in Syria. Vocational training has proven to be a vital lifeline in a region deeply affected by the conflict in Syria, which in 2022 has entered its eleventh year.

Vocational training courses include mechatronics, air-conditioning (AC) maintenance, sewing, computer maintenance, plumbing, and car electricity, along with medical, information, and engineering specialties.



In the meantime, AlAysh 48 Association launched the "Karama6" campaign to assist Palestinian and Syrian families sheltered in the substandard facilities set up in northern Syria.

The campaign, launched in partnership with donors from Palestinian territories occupied by Israel since 1948 and Beyaz Eller Association, comes as a snowstorm has hit Syria and the Middle East. Trucks laden with relief items, including 450 tons of wood, 4,000 blankets, 700 heaters, and 100 tons of flour, will be dispatched to northern Syria.

Heavy snowfall has affected north-west Syria since 18 January, damaging displacement sites, tents and people's belongings.
