Latest Developments

Concerns have been raised over the fate of 10 migrants, including three Palestinians from Syria, five Palestinians from the Israeli-blockaded Gaza Strip, and two Syrian nationals, who have gone missing west of the Turkish seashore, onboard a Greece-bound vessel, since March 27, 2019.

On Friday morning, the body of Palestinian refugee Mohamed Ismail AlBheisi was spotted off the Aegean coast.



Palestinian media sources quoted Palestine Ambassador in Ankara, Fayed Mustafa, as stating that the Turkish Foreign Ministry updated the embassy on AlBaheisi's death southwest of Turkey.

The names that figure on the list are: Palestinian refugees from Syria Mohamed Marwan Tamim, Mohamed Dhafer AlNajar, and Tareq Balout, along with Raed Mabrouk, Ziad Radi, Mohamed AlHasasna, Mohamed AlBaheisi, and Ahmad Sa'id from Gaza. Two other names—Amar Yaser Amouri and Mohamed Yaser Amouri, from Syria—figure on the list

“death boats” bound for Europe, as they rummaged around for a safe shelter.

AGPS kept record of the death of dozens of Palestinians at sea, trying to reach European destinations.

In another development, Palestinian refugees taking shelter in Ein AlHilweh Camp, south of Lebanon, have sounded distress signals over the security mayhem rocking the area.



A couple of days earlier, a member of Fatah Movement was killed by gunmen in the camp. His family and friends closed off the main access road to the camp with burning tires and roadblocks, calling for impeaching the criminals. A number of families fled the camp after tension hit a zenith.

Ein AlHilweh Camp used to provide shelter to 2,500 displaced Palestinian families from Syria in 2014, down from 870 in 2016. Recent statistics estimated the number of families at some 726.

Meanwhile, Palestinian refugee Sa'id Ahmed Sa'id has been locked up in Syrian state prisons for over five years.



Sa'id, born in 1967 and the father of three children, was arrested at the Ali AlWahsh checkpoint, south of Damascus, on January 5, 2014.

AGPS documented the secret detention of over 1,750 Palestinian refugees since the outburst of deadly hostilities in Syria.

In the meantime, a clothing exhibition was held by the Charity Commission for Relief of the Palestinian People two days earlier, in Lebanon's southern city of Sur (Tyre). Some 200 Palestinian refugee families from Syria and Lebanon benefited from the move.

Between April 16 and April 19, clothes were handed over to some 650 families with orphans and people with special needs in refugee camps set up in Sur.

Some 28,000 Palestinian refugees from Syria have been enduring dire conditions in the Lebanese territories due to their precarious legal status and lack of access to basic services.
