"Damascus Health Workers Union Honors Palestinian Technician"

Latest Developments

On October 26, the Damascus Health Workers Union honored the Palestinian technician Muhammad Ali Abu Eid, from Yarmouk camp.

Mohamed, working at the Directorate of Laboratories of Control and Drug Research, received a reward and a certificate of appreciation for his dedication and creativity.

According to the office of the Damascus Health Workers Syndicate, the refugee carried out maintenance work for expensive HPLC laboratory devices, helping the syndicate save millions of Syrian pounds.

In another development, representatives of the Fuel Company seized vehicles tasked with distributing heating oil to citizens' homes.

The fuel company said in a statement that it had seized licensed oil distribution cars in Rif Dimashq which forced civilians to show up at distribution points to receive their allowances, overburdening the cash-strapped families.

Following complaints filed by the residents, the company issued penalties against the drivers who have refused to deliver fuel supplies to addresses indicated on smart cards.



Meanwhile, humanitarian organizations appealed to European Union diplomats to pressurize the Greek government to backtrack on the projected deportation of a group of migrants from Turkey.

On Friday, Greek coast guard said a small cargo ship carrying about 400 migrants that suffered engine problems in the eastern Mediterranean Sea off the Greek island of Crete will be towed to a safe anchorage in Greece.

But by late Friday night, no port had been designated for the ship and there were signs the incident could turn into a diplomatic tussle with neighboring Turkey, Greece's regional rival from where the ship departed.

A coast guard statement said the Turkish-flagged freighter was located by a Greek search-and-rescue vessel east of Crete, following a tip that it needed assistance.

There was no indication that anybody on it was in ill health, although it was unclear how long it had been at sea and what its food and water situation was. The nationalities of the passengers and crew were unknown.

Sn official with knowledge of the operation initially told The Associated Press. on customary condition of anonymity, that a formal request was to be made to Turkey to take back the ship and its passengers, who meanwhile were expected to be temporarily sheltered in a Greek port. He said it had left from Turkey, and therefore under a 2016 migrant agreement between Ankara and the European Union, Turkey should take it back.

In the meantime, Syrian President Bashar al-Assad issued an administrative order to end the retention and recall of reserve officers, non-commissioned officers and reserve personnel, as of the beginning of 2022.

The decision to terminate the retention and summons of reserve officers included the description of officers and reserve personnel, according to the following:

A – Officers (retained and enrolled in the reserve service whose actual reserve service reached two years or more until the date of December 31, 2021 AD inclusive).

B- Human doctors who specialize in the management of medical services and whose actual reserve service reached two years or more until the date of December 31, 2021 AD inclusive, are dismissed according to the possibility of dispensing with their services.

The retention and recall of non-commissioned officers and reserve personnel shall be terminated as of 1/1/2022 according to the following:

Non-commissioned officers and individuals (retained and enrolled in the reserve service) whose actual reserve service has reached no



less than /6/ years and a half until the date of December 31, 2021 AD inclusive.
