Daily report on the situation of Palestinian refugees in Syria



"Renewed bombardment of Deraa camp and injuries recorded among the residents"

- Fighting between ISIS and the Free Palestine Movement on the Martyrs' sector axis in Yarmouk camp
- The Charitable Association for Palestinian Relief holds psychological support activities in Sabinah camp
- Syrian regime continues to detain four brothers from the Tamim family, for the third year
- Tensioned security conditions in Ain Al-Hilwah camp negatively affects the Palestinian-Syrians



Latest Developments

The Syrian regime forces renewed its bombardment of Deraa camp for Palestinian refugees in Deraa, south Syria, leading to a number of injuries among the civilians and material damage in the area.

This comes amid the major suffering experienced by the residents of the camp, because of the halt of all the medical services inside the camp, in addition to the complete drinking water and electricity cuts, that have reached their 1422th consecutive day.



In the same context, clashes described as violent broke out between ISIS and the Free Palestine Movement, one of the factions affiliated to the Syrian regime, on the Martyrs' sector axis in Yarmouk camp. No injuries were recorded on both sides.

Yarmouk camp continues to witness a state of expectancy, as a result of the deteriorated security state because of the clashes that broke out several days ago, between Hayat Tahrir Al-Sham and ISIS. The clashes resulted in the latter taking control of a number of Tahrir Al-Sham's sites. According to our correspondent, the civilians are unable to move freely, as they are within the range of the snipers' fire.



The Syrian security services continue to detain the four Palestinian brothers: "Mohammed Bashar Tamim," born in 1994, "Mohammed Ayman Tamim," born in 1984, "Mohammed Hady Tamim," born in 1987 and "Aly Tamim," born in 1992, for the third consecutive year.

The Syrian security detains many brothers and Palestinian families, including women and children, whose fate remains hidden to this date. A number of cases of siblings a families who have died due to torture in the Syrian regime's prisons have been recorded, such as the three brothers from the Hamdan family in Yarmouk camp, and the three sisters from the Saad Al-Din family in the Raml camp in Lattika, who died on 30-03-2015.

On its part, the Charitable Association for Palestinian Relief, cooperated with UNRWA to carry out activities to provide psychological support to the students in the Sabinah camp. The activities included theatrical shows and childrens' games. This comes amid the efforts made by the Association to relieve the suffering og the Palestinian-Syrian refugees, because of the Syrian war.

In Lebanon, the Ain Al-Hilwah camp, located in the city of Sidon, witnessed an explosion, followed by gunfire yesterday, causing panic among the residents and the Palestinian-Syrian refugees who were displaced to the camp.

The ongoing security tension and clashes which break out from time to time in the Ain Al-Hilwah camp, have aggravated the suffering of the thousands of Palestinian families living in it, and increased their concerns and fears after fleeing the war in Syria to Lebanon, in search of safety and security.

The Palestinian refugees have expressed their dissatisfaction from the clashes and their sense of insecurity in the Ain Al-Hilwah camp, which generate terrible human and material losses, in addition to the displacement of the residents of the camp and the negative impact on their economic and social lives, as well as the closure of the health and educational institutions.

Field reports have indicated that the number of families have decreased significantly than before. The number of families living in the camp in 2014 were 2500 families, where in 2015 they decreased to 1400 families. In early 2016, the number reached 870 families, and the latest statistics have revealed that there are only 726 Palestinian-Syrian families.

Palestinians of Syria: February 28, 2018 Statistics:

• The total number of victims documented by the Action Group is 3662, including 465 women



- 1666 Palestinians are locked up behind Syrian government's bars, 105 of which are women
- Yarmouk refugee camp is under the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine's siege for 1,686 days in a row
- 205 refugees, mainly in Yarmouk Camp, have died due to lack of medical care and malnutrition
- Water supplies have been cut off Deraa Camp for 1422 days, and 162 days in Yarmouk Camp
- The Regime army has been in control of Handarat camp for more than 517 days. More than 80% of its buildings have been completely or partially destroyed.
- Approximately 85 thousand Palestinian-Syrian refugees fled to Europe by the end of 2016
- 31 thousand refugees are located in Lebanon
- 17 thousand refugees are sheltered in Jordan
- 6 thousand refugees are in Egypt
- 8 thousand refugees are staying in Turkey
- One thousand refugees are present in Gaza
