Recent Updates

The AGPS correspondent in Aleppo confirmed that the "Ramoussa" road, which is the only outlet for the Neirab camp in Aleppo, was targeted amid reports about some injuries, including the Palestinian refugee "Saeed Sheikh Mohammed," who sustained multiple fractures.



The Neirab camp is strictly controlled by the Syrian regular army and some affiliated Palestinian groups due to the camp's strategic location close to the civil and military Neirab airports of the Syrian regime.

Turning to Damascus, where the Syrian regime aircraft targeted farms and towns surrounding Khan Al Shieh camp with at least 12 explosive barrels and resulted in a state of panic and fear among people, especially children.

Meanwhile, the regular army targeted the only road of Khan Al Shieh camp in the western suburb of Damascus with heavy weapons, while activists warned of the danger of crossing the road, noting that many of residents were killed as they passed through it.

The AGPS monitoring and documentation team announced that "9" Palestinian refugees from Khan Sheikh Camp died during May 2016, including five Palestinian refugees died on 17 / May; they are:

The child "Mohammad Majid Sanad," his mother "Rawda Jabr," "Hamza Mohamed Dali," "Hazem Hussein Hazza," and "Owaid Mazhor." The five refugees died as the regular army targeted a civilian car that was carrying a number of refugees while passing through the only road that connects between the camp and the center of the capital Damascus. Meanwhile, the Palestinian refugee Ahmed Hassan Awad died on 17/5 due to wounds he attained during the shelling of Khan Al Shieh camp.

The child, "Ahmed Zuhair Tehimar" died on 27/5 during the bombing that targeted different parts of Khan Al Shieh camp, while the Palestinian youth "Ashraf Sayyah Daly," from Al Mawasi clan, died due to torture in the prisons of the Syrian regime after being detained for a year. He was arrested while passing through Drousha checkpoint of the Syrian regime near the camp on 16/05/2015.

The Palestinian young man Nashaat Mohammed also died in 29/5 due to injuries he attained a few days ago as a result of the regular army shelling at Khan Al Shieh camp and surrounding farms.

The Palestinian refugees at Al Wafedein camp in Damascus suburb are suffering of cruel living conditions even before the war starts in Syria, due to the unemployment spread and the scarcity of financial resources. They also suffer of bad security situation and a state of permanent anxiety due to the armed opposition shells that targeted their camp and resulted in victims and injuries.

It is worth mentioning that Al Wafedein camp is located at the Northern entrance of Damascus city at the highway between Damascus and Homs. The camp is 20kg far from the capital Damascus; bounded on the north by the highway, from the south-east Adra prison, on the south bounded by Doma city, on the west bounded by Al Iskan suburb. The camp consists organizationally of three neighborhoods Jolan, Tashreen, and Al Thawra.

The camp is administratively follows Quneitra governorate, and was officially named (Batiha town for displaced people), and a population of about 53 thousand people, and the majority of its population displaced from the occupied Golan.

Civil Work Committees

Jafra Foundation continues to provide services to residents of the Yarmouk refugee camp who were displaced to the neighboring towns and Yalda, Babbila, and Beit Sahem.

The Foundation team also cleaned up the streets and lanes of the areas inhabited by the people of Yarmouk.

it is mentioned that hundreds of Palestinian families had been displaced from the Yarmouk refugee camp following the storming of ISIS early last April in coordination with members of Nusra Front, while most relief organizations operating in the Yarmouk had suspended its work after threats received from ISIS that is accused of assassinating a number of relief activists inside the camp



Palestinians of Syria Numbers and Statistics till 31\05\2016:

- 15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan
- 42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon
- 6000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015
- 8000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Turkey
- 1000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza

- More than 71.2 thousand Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till the End of December 2015
- The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1081 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1142 days, water was cut for 631 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.
- Al Sbeina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 935 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: All Residents have left the camp for about 1126 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 788 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
