#### **Victims**

The Palestinian Refugee, Abdulrahman Farid Azzam, from Nairab Camp in Aleppo, died while fighting alongside the Syrian Regime within the ongoing battles in Aleppo. Dozens of victims from Nairab Camp died while fighting alongside the Syrian regime against the armed opposition groups.



### Recent Updates

A number of mortar shells targeted different areas of Deraa camp south of Syria, and resulted in material damages.

Residents of the camp are still suffering due to the absence of relief and health care, as they have not received any aid for more than two years.

70% of the camp's buildings were completely and partially destroyed due to the frequent shelling with most types of shells and explosive barrels.

Meanwhile, Ezat Al Rasheq, member of the political office of Hamas, condemned the shelling of Khan Al Shieh camp with rockets, confirming that targeting the camp is not acceptable and condemnable, exposing the residents to ongoing siege which deepen their humanitarian tragedy.

Al Rasheq called to immediately stop bombing of Khan Al Shieh camp, targeting its residents, lifting the siege, and to neutralize the Palestinian camps from the furnace of the conflict in Syria.

Khan Al Shieh camp in the western Ghouta of the capital Damascus is considered one of the largest Palestinian refugee compounds in the Syrian territories. The camp and its surroundings have been targeted with the Syrian regime explosive barrels almost daily, which results in deaths and wounded among civilian residents and displaced people.



The camp's population is estimated with about 12 thousand people, as well as hundreds of displaced people who fled from the towns and cities of western Ghouta, such Maadameyat al-Sham, and Daria due to the deteriorating security conditions.

The Syrian regime continues to target the Palestinian refugee camps scattered along the Syrian lands from the south to the north with warplanes, tanks, rockets, explosive barrels, and mortar shells. The shelling led to massive destruction of properties and houses, in addition to the killing of more than 3274 victims among the Palestinian refugees, and thousands of injuries, according to the AGPS statistics.

In the meantime, members of the armed opposition in the town of Qudsaya in Damascus suburb, released the Palestinian refugee "Hussein - Abu Mohammed," from the Yarmouk refugee camp, after he was arrested six days ago under the pretext that his son served within the Palestine Liberation Army.

Activists confirmed that Abu Mohammed was arrested and his car was seized by the same opposition last year for 20 days, and then he was released after being beaten and being treated cruelly, noting that he was forced to sell his car at 500,000 SYP for members of the Syrian armed opposition in exchange for being released, according to the opposition.

In the south of the capital Damascus, Jafra Foundation for Relief and Youth Development continued, within Rajean campaign (4), distributing food baskets to the families of the Yarmouk refugee camp displaced to the town of Yalda, after census and audit carried out by the Commission for relief work for the Yarmouk people.

It is noteworthy that hundreds of Palestinian families had been displaced from the Yarmouk refugee camp following the storming of ISIS in the beginning of April (2015) in coordination with members of Nusra Front in Yarmouk. Many relief organizations working in the Yarmouk refugee

camp were forced to stop their work after threats received from ISIS which is accused of assassinating a number of relief activists inside the camp.



Palestine Charity Committee carried out Iftar for orphans with their relatives in Yalda area southern Damascus, as part of its entertainment and psychological support program for children, which includes several paragraphs that would relieve them of the burden of continuous years of war and displacement from their homes.

Children of Yarmouk suffer of difficult humanitarian situation because of the siege imposed by the regular army, which led to the absence of basic necessities of life such as food and drink. They also suffer from lack of medicines, drinking water, and electricity, as well as the control of ISIS on the Yarmouk camp on April 2015, which exacerbated their suffering and forced many families to flee to the neighboring towns of the camp.

The relief office of the Palestine Charity Committee offers monthly aid for (834) families, nearly (1916) people, including (205) family sponsored for orphans, in addition to guarantees for detained women, elderly, and patients.

#### Palestinians of Syria Numbers and Statistics till 30\06\2016:

- 15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan
- 42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon
- 6000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015
- 8000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Turkey
- 1000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza
- More than 71.2 thousand Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till the End of December 2015
- The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1108 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1170 days, water was cut for 659 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.
- Al Sbeina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 962 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: All Residents have left the camp for about 1 154 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 815 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
