- Situation of Palestinian Refugees Takes Turn for Worse South of Syria
- Member of AlQuds Brigade Arrested by Gov't Forces



Victims

Activists in AlAyedeen refugee camp in Hama unraveled the names of two more Palestinian refugees who died under torture in Syrian government lock-ups.

The families of Alaa Abdul Rahman Abdullah AlYamani and Ahmad Darweesh Makboul were notified of the death of their relatives under torture.

One day earlier, 18 Palestinian refugees taking shelter in AlAydeen Camp in Hama were pronounced dead.

Latest Developments

An engineering unit from the pro-government Liwa AlQuds battalion has begun clearing Handarat refugee camp, in Aleppo, from cluster bombs.

AGPS news correspondent said dozens of unexploded cluster bombs were amassed while dozens more were detonated away from populated areas. The remaining grenades are expected to be detonated sometime on Sunday.





Hundreds of the internationally-prohibited cluster grenades have been detected in Handarat Camp due to the heavy onslaughts launched by the Syrian and Russian fighter jets on the shelter.

Scores of Palestinian refugees were killed in offensives launched on refugee camps across war-torn Syria using such internationallyprohibited weapons as phosphorous-filled bombs and cluster grenades.

Meanwhile, alarm bells continue to be sounded over the humanitarian situation endured by Palestinian refugee communities south of Syria as a result of the military operations carried out by the government forces on southern Daraa neighborhoods. Jordan's closure of its borders has added bad to worse for Palestinians fleeing war-torn Syria.



Over recent days, scores of Daraa Camp residents were forced out of their homes due to the unabated shelling rocking the area. Several families have gone homeless.



Living conditions have gone far worse as a result of UNRWA's ongoing suspension of its relief services in Daraa and oppositionheld zones on account of the security turmoil rocking those areas.

In another development, Palestinian refugee Samer Rafe', a commander at the pro-government Liwaa AlQuds brigade, was arrested by government troops following a shootout with a government gunman at a checkpoint in Latakia.

Residents of AlNeirab Camp said ill-famed Samer Rafe' was once arrested on charges of armed robbery and property theft in Aleppo. At the time, Samer confessed to the charges on Syrian state media. He was released one year later.
