### "Heavy Shelling Targets Deraa Camp Resulted in Massive Destruction"

### **Recent Updates**

Heavy shelling with rockets and mortar shells targeted Deraa camp for Palestinian refugees southern Syria, while the AGPS reporter confirmed that the camp was targeted in the early morning hours of yesterday with missiles of "Alfeil."

The shelling coincided with a number of mortar shells were dropped on different areas of the camp, causing injuries and considerable material damage.



In a related context, the AGPS monitoring and documentation team announced that 7 Palestinians victims died in Deraa





province during last July, including four refugees were killed by the bombing of Deraa camp with explosive barrels.

Victims are:

The Palestinian refugee "Muhannad Hazza," from Deraa camp, died on July 6, during the ongoing clashes at Manshiya neighborhood in the city of Deraa between the regular army and armed opposition groups.

The young man "Nidal Ahmed Ali Salibi" also from Deraa camp and died on Tuesday July 7, after a number of shells were dropped on Al Kashif neighborhood in Deraa.

"Mohammed Darwish," from Deraa camp, died on the same day in the town of Naseib at Deraa Governorate after warplanes bombed the area.

Moreover, four Palestinian refugees died on July 22, due to heavy shelling that targeted Deraa camp; they are: Samaher Nawras Mahawish, the child Hamza Khaled el-Masri, the girl Aya Khaled el-Masri, and the girl Asmaa Mohammed Zulfi.

It is noteworthy that the AGPS documented 214 victims from Deraa camp mostly died due to bombing with missiles and explosive barrels, while a number of residents died during participation in the ongoing conflict in Syria.



Turning to Damascus suburb, where people of Jaramana camp, which is located eight kilometers from the Syrian capital, Damascus, the road to Damascus International airport, are living a state of tension caused by sounds of powerful explosions that rocked parts of the camp, and turned out to be resulted in the bombing of Kazaz area adjacent to the camp.



However, people of Jaramana camp are suffering of drinking water and electricity cut for long hours. It is noted that the camp, which live in a state of calm compared to other camps, suffers from difficult economic conditions, where residents are complaining of unemployment spread, high food prices, and high cost of homes rent.

On the other hand, the AGPS monitoring and documentation team confirmed that, until today they documented "1117" Palestinian victims died in the Yarmouk camp in Damascus.



Shelling, clashes, and torture to death were the main reasons that led to deaths, in addition to the siege imposed by the regular army and PFGC groups, which claimed the lives of "177" refugees who died due to malnutrition and medical care shortage.



In Lebanon, dozens of Palestinians of Syria and Lebanon refugees' families organized a sit in front of UNRWA's office in the Lebanese capital Beirut, to protest against the reduction of its services provided to Palestinian refugees in general, and Palestinians of Syria in particular.





Protestors demanded the Palestinian factions, the PLO, and the human rights organizations to put pressure on donor countries to meet financial obligations to UNRWA.

They also called UNRWA to back down its decisions, which will have a negative impact on their social, educational, and medical conditions.

The Group confirmed that it is working to provide many institutions, organizations, and international human rights bodies with such lists in Arabic and English, so as to activate the pressure on those who arrested and kidnapped Palestinian refugees in Syria.

It is worth mentioning that the statistics published on the AGPS website "[actionpal.org.uk](http://actionpal.org.uk)" indicates that the number of male and female detainees who have been documented so far is (934) male and female Palestinian prisoners, in addition to 277 missing.





❖ **Numbers and Statistics till 31/7/2015:-**

- 80,000 Palestinian refugees escaped from Syria, including 10,687 refugees in Jordan, 51300 refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till February 2015.
- At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.
- The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 759 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 829 days, water was cut for 319 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 177 victims.
- Al Husayneyya Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 640 days respectively.
- Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 621 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: - Residents have left the camp for 823 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 466 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.



- Jarmana, AL Saieda ZAINAB, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Shieh road.
