"After his Parents Death, A Child Meets his Grandmother after 5 Months"



- Shelling Targets the Vicinity of Khan Al Shieh Camp and Injuries among Civilians

Recent Updates

The Palestinian Syrian refugee, Hajar Saleh, found her grandchild, the son of her daughter Amna, who died with her husband, Jaafar Imad Azouz, at the Turkish-Syrian borders at Sloubi area. According to relatives, the grandmother met the child at the Turkish territories after great efforts.

Şırnak Turkish Hospital confirmed that the child "Jafar" died and that the hospital had to bury him, but one of the human rights organizations confirmed later that he was alive in the orphanage in "Sloubi" in Turkish, and is seeking to return him to his family.



It is noteworthy that his parents Amna Salah and Imad Azzouz were shot and killed by the Turkish army while trying to cross the Syrian-Turkish border on 02/14/2016.

the other hand, the AGPS correspondent in Damascus suburb reported that a number of residents were injured due to a Russian air strike, where two rockets targeted the road between Khan Al Shieh and Zakia town, as a mortar shell targeted houses in the western lane of the camp.

Our correspondent added that the bombing coincided with the Internet cut off from the region (terrestrial and mobile) for the first time, while a state of panic spread among the residents, especially children and women for fear of being targeted.

The AGPS monitoring and documentation team announced that 5 Palestinian refugees from Khan Al Shieh camp died during July 2016. The refugees are: Mahmoud Omar Said, Mahmoud Saeed Mohammed (Abu Suhaib), Hassan Sobhi Saleh, Basil Yousef, and the 16-year-child Mohammed Emad Raheel. The 5 refugees died after Russian warplanes launched air strikes on Khan Al Shieh camp in Damascus Suburb, which resulted in a state of panic among residents, in addition to a number of casualties and wounded.

It should be noted that the number of Palestinian refugees from Khan Sheikh Camp who died because of the war in Syria has reached more than "180" refugees, according to the AGPS documented statistics.

In Damascus suburb, residents of Sbeina camp in the south-western Damascus suburb are waiting for a governmental decision to end the tragedy of displacement for nearly a thousand days, and states to open roads to the area and return to their homes.

The so-called "reconciliation committee" in the town said that residents are waiting the decision to return to their homes, and most of them want to speed up the decision to return before the school year in next September, where displaced people are severely suffering from the high cost of rents and the high cost of living especially as they are employees and workers who have suffered over three years of significant losses".

The Committee added that the lists of families who have registered to return to the town were handed over to the competent authorities and amounted to 9136 families, including 41,211 citizens, stressing that residents will be able to return in parallel with the repair workshops and restoration of infrastructure in order to gain time.



It should be noted that the regular army and some Palestinian groups prevent people of Sbeina camp to return to their homes for (933) days after being forced to leave because of the violent clashes between the regular army and groups of armed opposition, which ended with the regular army full control over the camp.

Waqfiyat Al-Qibla Al-Oula for Quran Memorization honored the 9-year-child, Muna Muhsen Abdulrahman, from the Palestinian Syrians who were displaced to Beddawi camp. Muna was born blind, and her award is a special laptop with "Beryl" language for the blind. She was awarded for memorizing three parts of the Quran, during the conclusion of



the contest held in the municipality of Sidon, south Lebanon .

It is noteworthy that the number of Palestinian refugees who came from Syria to Lebanon is 42 thousand refugees spread over all Palestinian areas and refugee camps. Their legal status is considered one of the most prominent suffering, as well as prevent them from working.

Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics till 31\07\2016:

- 15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan
- 42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon
- 6000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015
- 8000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Turkey
- 1000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza
- More than 71.2 thousand Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till the End of December 2015
- The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1140 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1201 days, water was cut for 690 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.
- Al Sheina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 993 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: All Residents have left the camp for about 1 185 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 846 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.
