"2596 Palestinian Refugees Died Till the End of 2014"

Recent Updates

The AGPS announced, through its website "actionpal.org.uk", that the number of victims, who were documented till the end of 2014, has reached 2596 victims, who were killed in the Yarmouk camp in Damascus. The AGPS also noted that it will soon issue its detailed report about the Palestinian victims who died due to the ongoing war in Syria.



In another hand, strong explosions rocked Jermana camp in Damascus suburb due to the raged clashes between the Syrian opposition forces and the Syrian regime forces at the adjacent area, resulted in a state of panic and fear among the residents who are complaining of overcrowdings and the shortage of basic services in addition to the scarcity of food, fuel, and medicine.

It is mentioned that Jermana camp receives thousands of displaced families who fled from the Palestinian camps and adjacent areas due to the deteriorating security situation.

In the same context, the regular army and the Palestinian groups loyal to it continue to prevent the residents of Al Husseneia and Sbeina camps to return back to their houses, without clear reasons, while the Syrian regular army is completely controling those camps after violent clashes that broke out between the regular army alongside with some Palestinian factions loyal to it and groups of the free army, while these clashes ended up with the full control of the regular army at Al Husseneia camp since October 2013, and Al Sbeina camp since November 2013.

The activities that demand the return of the two camps' residents are still continuing, as it was mentioned that the residents of the two camps were distributed on the camps and the adjacent towns, which increased the economic burdens, especially after raising the houses rents and the spread of unemployment.

Meanwhile, Fatah movement at the Yarmouk camp in Damascus commemorated its 50th anniversary through a march, as they chanted the movement slogans and called to neutralize the camp before they head to Al Shohadaa cemetery to reciting surat Al Fatiha for the souls of the martyrs.

On the other hand, the services team of Jafra foundation continues to provide its relief services to the besieged residents in an attempt to alleviate the impacts of the strict siege imposed by the regular army and groups of PFGC for 544 days. The team continues to clean the streets and remove the rebels of the repeated shelling. It is mentioned that the water cut continues for about 114 days, while the siege has led to the death of 158 victims from the Yarmouk camp.

In Turkey, a number of Palestinian families, who came from Syria, implemented a protest about the decision of evacuating Kilis shelter center, as they demanded to secure them an alternative shelter in case of evacuating Kilis center. The protestors stressed on their hard living and economic situation that prevent them from renting a house, as the Turkish

police went to place of the sit-in and listened to the protestors demands with the attendance of a representative of Al Wali Office.


In Italy, the Italian coast guards rescued a boat that was launched from Mercin on 25thof December 2014, as the boat was carrying a number of Palestinian Syrian and Syrian refugees, while the Italian authorities clarified that the number of the immigrants who have arrived to Italy has ten times exceeded the past years.

It is mentioned that hundreds of Palestinian Syrian families had to ride what is known as "Death Boats" that launch from the Egyptian, Libyan, and Turkish shores carrying the refugees from the European shores without any safety conditions.

The Palestinian Camps in Syria, Numbers and Statistics till 31/12/2014:-

- At least 27933 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.
- 2596 Palestinian refugees were documented by the AGPS including 157 women, 283 were killed due to torture, 268 were killed by sniper shot, 84 refugees were field executed, and 984 refugees were killed due to bombing.
- The Yarmouk Camp: Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 544 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 624 days, water was cut for 114 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached 158 victims.
- 80,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees escaped from Syria to the neighboring towns, including 14348 refugees in Jordan, 42,000 in Lebanon, according to UNRWA statistics till November 2014.
- Al Husayneyya Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 446 days respectively.
- Al Sbeina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 416 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: Residents have left the camp for 617 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.

- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 261 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia road.
