"4,013 Palestinian Refugees from Syria Pronounced Dead until End of 2019"

Latest Developments

AGPS has documented the death of 4,013 Palestinian refugees from Syria, including hundreds of women and children, since 2011, as a result of war-related incidents.

AGPS found out that hundreds of refugees were killed under shelling and hundreds of others were fatally gunned down.

At least 614 refugees were tortured to death in Syrian dungeons while 205 others died as a result of medical neglect and the tough blockade imposed by Syria's government forces on Yarmouk Camp.



The list also includes 311 Palestinians who were killed by sniper bullets, 142 who died in blasts, and 92 who were extra-judicially executed. 87 refugees died, meanwhile, of unknown reasons, and 52 died on migration boats. Another 25 refugees were assassinated.

Scores of Palestinian refugees have also been left wounded, including dozens who have undergone limp amputation or eye loss.

In the meantime, the Damascus Criminal Court issued on Tuesday a death sentence against the 20-year-old student Fares Haitham Taameh, on charges of killing the Palestinian doctor Lara



Hisham Hasan Shehadeh and her child Lama on April 19, 2018, in their house in the town of Zakia, in Rif Dimashq.

An investigation carried out by the Syrian criminal security forces found out that the motives for the crime were robbery and theft.



Following the murder, the criminal stole USD 20,000 and 5 million Syrian pounds in addition to a golden jewelry from the house.

Forensic examination showed that the mother and her daughter were subjected to cruel tortured and got their bodies mutilated before and after the murder.

Meanwhile, the Documentation Center of Palestinian Refugees in Northern Syria called on displaced Palestinian refugees in Idlib and Aleppo's northern suburbs to show up at the center in order to register their personal information and obtain the necessary identity documents.

The Documentation Center of Palestinian Refugees North of Syria was established in order to keep record of and provide personal data about Palestinian refugees sheltered in northern Syria. The group cooperates with the concerned authorities to that end.



The center has reportedly seen the day in response to the absence of authentic civil records and official bodies documenting the personal data (including marriage contracts, birth date, death date, number of children and newborns etc...) of the Palestinian refugees who have been taking shelter in northern Syria.

In another development, the Palestinians of Syria Commission for Relief and Development distributed fuel supplies to families displaced from Maarat AlNomen to Harnaboush town, north of Syria.

The charity also installed 16 residential makeshift tents to displaced families.

Along similar lines, Khayra Ummah Association, in partnership with HandinHand – Germany embarked on an emergency relief project for displaced families in northern Syria. Winter blankets, tents, and heating material were handed over to the concerned families as part of the "Warmth and Peace" winter campaign.



Hundreds of Palestinian families have been struggling for survival in poorly-equipped camps set up north of Syria, after they were forced out of Yarmouk and southern Damascus towns. For many displaced Palestinian refugees, the perils of winter weather add to the torment already experienced throughout the conflict.
