

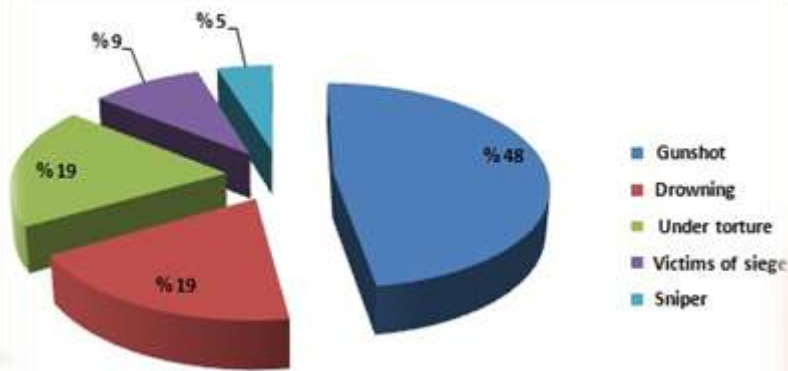

"21 Palestinian Refugees Killed in Syria Over The Course Of January 2016"



- A pro-Assad fighter from Fateh-Alintifada has been killed in Syria.
- Panic and tension among pupils in Khan Eshieh camp in the wake of targeting the outskirts of the camp by 4 raids.
- Health awareness campaign launches in Alayedeen camp in Homs.
- "Ali Al-Shehabi" still arrested by Syrian security for the second year.
- Italy donates € 1 million to support Palestinian refugees from Syria.

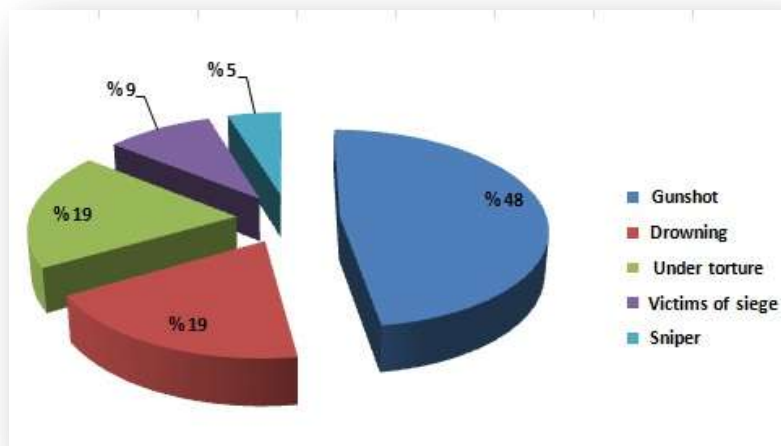


STATISTICS

AGPS monitoring team revealed a new statistics of Palestinian refugee victims over the past last month. The (21) victims revealed by the report had been killed in January 2016, 17 inside Syria and 4 outside. The report indicated that (11) victims killed by gunshot, one of them by a sniper shot, and (4) tortured to death, while (2) as a result of lack of medical care in the besieged areas, and (4) drowned in the sea as they were trying to reach Europe.

AGPS pointed out that the victims categorised by the Syrian cities as following: (4) from Damascus, (4) form Damascus Suburb, (3) form Dara'a and (10) from different areas.

It is worth noting that (3117) victims have been documented by AGPS over the course of last 5 years.



VICTIMS

A Palestinian refugee has died of wounds sustained from the explosion targeted Alsayed-Zainb in Damascus in 31 January 2016.



The 22-years-old "Khalil Mohamed Ebraheem" announced dead in the hospital two days following the explosion. It is worth mentioning that Ebraheem is a fighter from Fateh-Alintifada, A pro-Assad Palestinian faction.



RECENT UPDATES

A state of panic and tension spread out among pupils in Khan Eshieh camp after 4 raids carried out by the Syrian air forces. The raids targeted the west outskirts of the camp in Almanshieh and Alabbasa areas. 2500 pupils were inside school classes when the warplanes flying at low attitude over the camp caused fears and tension amidst the people in the camp.



The fears come under a heavy memory, where the Syrian planes bombed a UNRWA school in 16 June 2015 by explosive barrels causing many casualties and complete destruction of the school. In addition, some



buildings were affected by the explosion in UNRWA school then resulted in 2 wounded children then.

In the middle of Syria in Homs, the Red Crescent launched a health awareness campaign in Alayedeen camp against the Seasonal Flu in UNRWA schools. The campaign started in Albarwa School is meant to be extended to all other schools in the camp later. In their turn, volunteers of the Red Crescent provided advices and guidelines to the students concerning how to prevent diseases through personal hygiene. They distributed leaflets to people in the camp in order to prevent Swine flu (H1N1).

In a different context, the Syrian regime continues arresting "Ali Al-Shehabi" since 2 February 2014. The 25-year-old had been arrested by Syrian security at the entrance of Al-Yarmouk Camp, where he attended to the point of aid distribution. About (130) had been arrested in the same place of Al-Yarmouk, activists and eyewitnesses said. However, there is no information about their fate so far.





UNRWA announced that Italy has donated € 1 Million (\$1.09 M) to support Palestinian refugees in Syria. The agency said; the funding comes with the struggling of Palestinians in Syria to cope with the severest humanitarian crisis they experienced in decades, and as a part of assistance provided in response to crisis of Al-Yarmouk in April 2015.

The press release, published on the website, explained that this donation enabled UNRWA to provide assistance to (33,708) refugees from Palestine through (8,427) food packages, in addition to (4,500) hygiene kits. The assistance, included preservatives, aiming to enable Palestinian refugees to secure their daily living needs, press release mentioned.

The assistance distributed in (15) points all over the country. (10) in Damascus and (1) each in Aleppo, Dara'a, Hama, Homs and Latakia. These points allow UNRWA to reach all Palestinian refugees inside Syria, who are nearly (450,000), according to UNRAW.

Palestinians of Syria in numbers and statistics Until 1 February 2016

- 15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 42,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.*
- More than 71,200 Palestinian Syrian refugees have arrived Europe until the end of December 2015.*
- The Yarmouk Camp: still under siege imposed by the Syrian Regime's Army and PFLP-GC (Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine – General Command), continued for 961 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 1023*



days, water cut for 511 days. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 185 victims .

- *Al Sbeina Camp: Syrian Regime's Army still preventing the residents from returning back to their houses for 817 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: All of its residents have left the camp for 1010 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: Running water cut continues for 671 days, and 70% of its buildings were destroyed.*
- *Jarmana, AL-SaiedaZainab, Al-Raml, Al-Aedein Homs and AedeinHama: A relatively quiet situations in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia-Khan EShieh road.*
