




Latest Developments

AGPS kept record of the names of 3,453 Palestinian refugees killed in the raging Syrian warfare.

The data was amassed by AGPS field reporters scattered across over 20 flashpoints in and outside war-tattered Syria.

AGPS also documented the incarceration of 1,169 Palestinians in Israeli government lock-ups.

Several workshops have been held by AGPS in Geneva and London, in partnership with the London-based Palestinian Return Center (PRC). AGPS has also held exhibitions in Sweden, the Netherlands, Turkey, Austria, Lebanon, and Germany, as part of its underway endeavors to document the situation of Palestinian refugees in Syria.

Meanwhile, 459 Palestinian refugees have been tortured to death in Syrian regime penitentiaries, amid growing concerns over the fates of hundreds of detainees whose situation has been shrouded in mystery due to the gag orders slapped by the Syrian government.

In another development, though the situation remains relatively calm in Hama-based AlAydden Camp, the residents have been grappling with a tough cordon enforced by the regime army on the main access roads out of and into the shelter. Abrupt break-ins and abduction sweeps by the government troops have added bad to worse.

Residents of AlAydeen Camp have also been facing high rates of unemployment as hundreds have been laid off due to the security mayhem rocking the area. Therefore, survival for the majority of civilians sheltered in the camp has largely hinged on relief aids.



Palestinians of Syria: March 1, 2017 Statistics:

• At least 3,453 Palestinians, including 455 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.

- 1,169 Palestinian refugees, including 83 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.
- Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,350 days in a row.
- 190 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.
- Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,054 and 862 days.
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,398 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 132 days.
- Government troops ban residents of AlSbiena Camp from returning to their homes for 1,203 days running.
- Over 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.
- 31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.
- 17 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.
- 6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.
- 8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.
- 1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.
