## "PLA Fighter Killed in Raging Warfare, Another Released in Swap Deal"

#### Latest Developments

Palestinian refugee Mahmoud Ahmed Taleb AlZinghari, from the Palestine Liberation Army (PLA), was killed as he fought alongside the government forces in Syria.



AGPS documented the death of 202 PLA militants in war-ravaged Syria.

Meanwhile, Palestinian refugee Mohamed Hassan Mustafa Salayma, from the PLA, was released following a prisoner swap deal between the government forces and Jaysh AlIslam in Rif Dimashq.

Salayma, a resident of Hums-based AlAydeen Camp, was reportedly kidnapped by the government forces in Hums on September 23, 2012.

157 Palestinians sheltered in AlAydeen Camp have been held in Syrian government lock-ups, according to AGPS figures. No exact figures are available on the number of detainees held in opposition-led penitentiaries.

Several Palestinian youths fled the Syrian territories after they were forced to join the PLA.

In a related development, the Syrian government forces on Wednesday struck Daraa Camp with barrel bombs, resulting in heavy material damage.



80% of Daraa buildings have been reduced to rubble in the rampant warfare, forcing several families to seek shelter elsewhere. Those who have remained in the camp have been subject to abject conditions due to the tough cordon enforced by the government army. Civilians continue to launch cries for help over the acute shortage in much-needed foodstuff and the frequent power, water, and telecommunication cuts-off.

At the same time, a government onslaught hit Yarmouk Camp for Palestinian refugees.

A couple of days earlier, violent clashes burst out between Tahrir AlSham and ISIS in Haifa Street. Light and medium weapons were used in the clashes. Clashes also flared up in Palestine Street between AlKara'in battalion and Fatah AlIntifada.

In the meantime, government-allied sources said four critically wounded fighters affiliated with AlNusra, along with 12 family members of their own, were deported from Yarmouk to Idlib as part of the four-town agreement made between the Syrian government and the opposition groups.

Along the same line, member of the Palestinian popular commission Abu Saleh Fatyan and civil defense chief in the camp Abu Quteiba were released by ISIS in southern Damascus after they were kidnapped a few days earlier.

Civilians stranded in Tahrir AlSham-run zones west of besieged Yarmouk, including in AlRija, Jadat, Ein Ghazal, Street 15, AlThalatheen Street have been enduring dire conditions. A tough cordon has also been imposed on the area by ISIS and the pro-regime forces for 1,413 days running.

In another development, the Palestinian Red Crescent Society in Lebanon denied that it had distributed rotten food to the Palestinians from Syria in AlBadawi Camp during the first and second days of Ramadan.

According to a Red Crescent statement emailed to AGPS, the organization's delegates in Safad Clinic distributed meals cooked in a restaurant in Tripoli using an air-conditioned vehicle, in partnership with the Kuwaiti Red Crescent and the Lebanese Red Cross.

The statement added that no cases of intoxication or health disorders have been reported over recent days in Safad clinic or other Tripolibased hospitals.

#### Palestinians of Syria: June 1, 2017 Statistics:

- At least 3,506 Palestinians, including 462 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.
- 1,603 Palestinian refugees, including 99 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.
- Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,410 days in a row.
- 196 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.
- Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,145 and 996 days.
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,489 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 223 days.

- Nearly 85,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until the end of 2016.
- 31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.
- 17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.
- 6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.
- 8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.
- 1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.
