"Shelling Targets Khan AL Shieh and Kills a Palestinian Refugee and 4 Displaced People from the Same Family, Including Two Children"

Victims

The Palestinian refugee, Hisham Yahya Shahabi, from Khan Al Shieh camp, died after his car was targeted on Zakia Khan Al Shieh road.

Meanwhile, the 20-year-old Palestinian Syrian refugee, Mohammed Ziad Forana, from Yarmouk Deir Yaseen Street, died due to torture in the Syrian regime's prisons after being detained for more than 3 years.



He was arrested three years ago at a checkpoint of Jaramana town in Damascus while returning on leave during his military service in the Palestinian Liberation Army to visit his family after the end of his military course in Masyaf camp.

The AGPS documented 447 victims among the Palestinian refugees who died due to torture in the prisons of the Syrian regime.

Recent Updates

Russian and Syrian warplanes implemented new raids on the eastern and western neighborhood of Khan Al Shieh camp in Damascus suburb, leading to four victims from the same displaced family; they are:



Mohammad Asad, his wife, and two small children, one of the is two years old, and the second child is two months old baby, in addition to a number of wounded, including women and children, as well as considerable damage to homes and properties. The Palestinian refugee, Hisham Yahya Shahabi, from Khan Al Shieh camp, died after his car was targeted on Zakia Khan Al Shieh road, bringing the number of Palestinian refugees who have died since the beginning of the ongoing conflict in Syria to 3303 victims.



Air strikes that targeted the Khan Al Shieh camp was sharply escalated during the past few weeks and days, which resulted in tens of deaths and injuries among residents of the camp as well as the displaced people who escaped the shelling and the explosive barrels that target the adjacent towns and villages.

In the south of Syria near Aleppo, air strikes targeted different places of Handarat camp, coincided with violent clashes that broke out between the Syrian army alongside Alquds brigade and the armed opposition groups, where all heavy and medium weapons were used.



In Aleppo, the Regular Army took over Al-Kastelo Street – the only outlet for the militant factions in the east of Aleppo- after 2 weeks of violent clashes between the Armed Opposition and the Regular Army

It is mentioned that the camp is completely evacuated of residents, where they were forced to leave because of the violent clashes between the Regular Army and opposition about 1185 days ago, where the opposition controlled the camp, and prevent the return of residents, whilst the camp was exposed to frequent bombing and explosive barrels that destroyed about 80% of buildings in the camp.

On the other side, Fawzi hamed- Head of Civil Council in Yarmouk - revealed an imminent agreement between Syrian regime, POL, and ISIS to end the Yarmouk siege, adding that the agreement will be signed and announced within 2 days.

The agreement includes 5 main points:

A cease-fire in the camp, in all its forms

Prevention of violence in neighboring areas, including Altadamon neighborhood

Opening a safe passage in Yarmouk from Palestine Street

Facilitating the entry of all kinds of aid into the Yarmouk refugee camp to subsistence Center

Facilitating the entry and exit of citizens, and not to arrest any person under any circumstance



Hamed – who is in the camp- reported to news agencies that the camp's residents live without electricity since the beginning of the siege in 27/6/2013, 12,000 people in the camp depend on the generators and wide areas of the camp suffer the shortage of water and internet.

Hamed confirmed that the camp's residents depend basically on UNRWA aids, pointing out to better conditions than before, where residents were starving because of lack of food

Hamed accused ISIS of imposing administrative orders on the residents claiming that it is Islamic religious Law, where they prevent smoking, drugs, music, songs, immodest dress, and cursing God otherwise they will be punished.

He also said that, ISIS detained many people because of smoking, for one or two days or more, while women to be advised and guided otherwise they will be punished, and those who curse God without regret will be killed.

It is mentioned that civil and military institutions in the Yarmouk camp negotiated with the Syrian regime, but unfortunately these negotiations failed because of the security services believe that any agreement is a threat, activists said.

Meanwhile, 20 families, about 100 people, including children, women, and elderly people have been stranded for more than 7 months in Izaz area in the north of Aleppo near the Syrian-Turkish borders . The AGPS renewed their appealing for International and humanitarian organizations, the Palestinian Embassy and General Commissioner for Refugees to intervene in order to help them to enter Turkish territory.



They confirmed that they have tried many times to enter the Turkish lands but they failed due to the spread of the Turkish army along the Syrian borders, in addition to the fear of smuggling.

In terms of the humanitarian aspect, they suffer from miserable and harsh living conditions, as they sleep in the open among the olive trees, which impacted negatively on their health and psychological conditions, children in particular.

It is noteworthy that Turkey has established smart monitoring towers, where it monitors any moving object approaching the Turkish-Syrian border, in addition to warnings in Turkish, English and Arabic languages for each moving object approaching 300 meters from the border.

- *1000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza*
- *More than 71.2 thousand Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till the End of December 2015*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1141 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1202 days, water was cut for 691 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 994 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - All Residents have left the camp for about 1 186 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 847 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jermana, AL Saieda Zainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.*
