Daily report on the situation of Palestinian refugees in Syria



" Clashes between 'ISIS' and Syrian opposition burn down several houses in Yarmouk Camp on first day of Eid Al-Adha"

- 2500 Palestinians displaced from "Khan Eshieh" camp denied UNRWA services.
- Neighboring countries close their borders, preventing displaced Palestinian-Syrians from meeting their families.



Latest Developments:

The Action Group for Palestinians of Syria's correspondent in Yarmouk Camp, confirmed the eruption of clashes between ISIS and armed Syrian opposition groups in the town of Yalda.

The clashes broke out at dawn on the first day of Eid al-Adha, in the Zein neighborhood and Orouba Street. Both ends used intermediate bombs and weapons, leading to the burning down of several civilian homes.



ISIS had taken control of Yarmouk Camp, early April 2015, after violent clashes against the Syrian opposition groups and with the support the Al-Nusra Front – now known as "Tahrir al-Sham".

On another note, Eid al-Adha has come and hundreds of Palestinian –Syrian displaced families that moved from the Khan Eshieh refugee camp located in rural Damascus, to the city of Idlib, continue to suffer from deteriorated living conditions, in the absence of any relief role by UNRWA.

The Action Group is continuously receiving several complaints from these displaced refugees, where they are bearing UNRWA



responsibility for the deterioration of their conditions, and blaming them for not doing their duty towards them.

The displaced demanded that the agency responsible for Palestinian refugees in Syria commits to its duties towards the hundreds of women and children suffering from poor humanitarian conditions in the city.

Starting from Monday 28th November 2018, almost 2500 refugees have been forcibly displaced from Khan Eshieh camp for Palestinian refugees in rural Damascus, and sent to Idlib in Northern Syria. This comes after a reconciliation agreement was signed between the Syrian regime and the opposition in Khan al-Sheih and the surrounding areas.



In a similar context, more than 120 thousand Palestinian refugees in Syria are suffering from an emotional state that has tarnished their excitement for Eid al-Adha. The war led to the dispersal of the refugees across more than 20 countries. Europe alone has received more than 82 thousand Palestinian-Syrians. Barely have any families survived being displaced or dispersed around the world or across the Syrian towns and cities.



Statistics have shown that the Palestinian-Syrians have been distributed between Lebanon, Jordan, Egypt, Turkey, Libya and Sudan. With addition to Thailand, Malaysia, Sweden, Denmark, Germany, the UK, the Netherlands, Finland, Switzerland, France, Brazil, Chile, Canada and other countries.

UNRWA latest reports also show that more than 120,000 Palestinian refugees fled the country because of the war in Syria.

Neighboring Arab countries' embassies exacerbated the situation, by hindering the issuance of any entry visas to their countries, for any refugees coming from Europe or Syria, making family reunions even more difficult.

Palestinians of Syria: September 1, 2017 Statistics:

- The total number of victims documented by the Action Group is 3569, including 462 women
- 1632 Palestinians are locked up behind Syrian government's bars, 103 of which are women
- Yarmouk refugee camp is under the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine's siege for 1,507 days in a row
- 197 refugees, mainly in Yarmouk Camp, have died due to lack of medical care and malnutrition
- Water supplies have been cut off Deraa Camp for 1244 days,
 and 1085 days in Yarmouk Camp



- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo have been banned from their homes for 1,580 days. Government troops have taken over the camp for more than 333 days.
- Approximately 85 thousand Palestinian-Syrian refugees fled to Europe by the end of 2016
- 31 thousand refugees are located in Lebanon
- 17 thousand refugees are sheltered in Jordan
- 6 thousand refugees are in Egypt
- 8 thousand refugees are staying in Turkey
- One thousand refugees are present in Gaza
