Latest Developments

Reporting from Southern Syria, AGPS news correspondent said dozens of Palestinian and Syrian families sheltered in Yarmouk Basin, in Deraa's western outskirts, fled the area for fear of being killed in the simmering hostilities between ISIS militias and the opposition outfits.

ISIS-affiliated Khaled Ibn AlWalid brigade held sway over Yarmouk Basin territories, including Tseil, Jileen, Sahem, and Tel AlJomou', following clashes rocking the area over the past ten days.



Most of those displaced from the area have sought refuge in Yarmouk River while others fled to AlMuzeireeb, Zizoun, and Amouriya. Other families have been stranded in ISIS-led areas.

At the same time, a number of Palestinian families have been taking cover at local schools and mosques after they had gone homeless.

Over recent months, hundreds of displaced Palestinians have been sheltered in the Syrian-Libyan dairy farm, near Jilin town, having no other place to run to.

Palestinians taking refuge in southern Syria have been enduring abject living conditions. The situation has gone downhill due to the sharp decline in relief aids.

Located some 25 kilometers way from northwestern Deraa city center, Jileen Camp is home to 500 families, mostly displaced from northern 1948 Occupied Palestine (Green Line), the occupied West Bank, and the blockaded Gaza Strip. Meanwhile, Tseil town, northwest of Deraa, provides provisional housing to some 120 Palestinian families.

In the meantime, AGPS has conducted nearly 1,600 daily reports documenting the situation of the Palestinians of Syria.

The reports are available on the group's website both in English and Arabic: www.actionpal.org.uk. Other material, including videos, live snapshots, statistics on the number of casualties and detainees, news articles, and press releases also figure on the website.

AGPS is a London-based human rights watchdog that monitors the situation of Palestinian refugees in war-torn Syria without bias or a political agenda.

AGPS saw the day in October 2012, following a workshop held by the Palestine Return Center (PRC) to discuss the situation of Palestinian refugees in Syria.

AGPS material is purely fact-based and rooted in real data compiled by a team of professional journalists, on-the-spot reporters, news correspondents, veterans, and local activists.

Civil Action Commissions

A celebration was held by the Palestine Charity Commission in southern Damascus to honor learners at AlQuds School for their academic excellence.

Honor awards were handed over to outstanding students receiving elementary, preparatory, or secondary education at the school.

According to the commission, 221 learners were honored during the celebration, sparking a gleam of hope among the Palestinian refugee community in war-tattered Syria.

The teaching staff at Palestine Alternative School also distributed awards to brilliant learners from all levels.

The school headmistress said the recorded success rate exceeded 90% at the institution, providing education to some 400 learners. The school is run by the Jafra Foundation for Relief and Development.

Bloody hostilities in Syrian have dramatically imperiled the education process for the Palestinians and Syrians alike, resulting in a swift increase in the school drop-out rates.

Palestinians of Syria: March 2, 2017 Statistics:

- At least 3,453 Palestinians, including 455 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.
- 1,169 Palestinian refugees, including 83 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.
- Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,351 days in a row.
- 190 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.
- Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,055 and 863 days.
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,399 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 133 days.
- Government troops ban residents of AlSbiena Camp from returning to their homes for 1,204 days running.
- Over 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.
- 31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.
- 17 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.
- 6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.
- 8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.
- 1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.
