## **Latest Developments**

The family of Palestinian refugee Jihad Odeh, missing since January 01, 2022, said they finally managed to contact him after they learned that he is taking shelter in a migrant facility in Austria.

Jihad Odeh, born in 1982 and raised in Yarmouk Camp, south of Damascus, disappeared as he tried to reach Hungary from Serbia.

According to AGPS data, 333 Palestinian refugees from Syria, including 37 women and girls, have gone missing since the outbreak of the Syrian warfare.

In another development, staff at the UNRWA clinic in AlAyedeen Camp for Palestinian refugees, in Hums, announced the launch of a vaccination campaign in the next few weeks.

The residents will be receiving vaccine doses on Monday and Tuesday every week at the clinic for those aged 18 and above.

Those suffering from cold and influenza should not show up at the clinic until they fully recover.

Palestinians taking shelter in AlAyedeen Camp in Hums have been facing a deteriorating humanitarian situation as a result of the price leap, sharp shortage in fuel supplies, the frequent power blackouts, and absence of humanitarian assistance. High rates of unemployment and the security turmoil rocking the region have made the situation far more alarming.



Meanwhile, power cables have reportedly been stolen from the alleyways of AlNeirab refugee camp, in the northern Syrian province of Aleppo, where civilians' life has already been marred by the frequent power blackouts.

Local sources told AGPS that power cables have been stolen by thieves. Others attributed the phenomenon to the calamitous humanitarian condition endured by several families in the camp.

The residents urged the local authorities to carry out the necessary maintenance works and rehabilitate the power network in the camp.

In the meantime, Khayra Ummah organization has distributed garments and blankets in displacement camps in northern Syria as part of the third phase of its humanitarian campaign.

Hundreds of Palestinian families have been struggling for survival in the poorly-equipped Deir Ballout and Muhammadiya camps, after they were forced out of Yarmouk and southern Damascus towns. For many displaced Palestinian refugees, the perils of winter weather add to the torment already experienced throughout the conflict.

In mid-January this year, a snowstorm hit north-west Syria, damaging displacement sites, tents and people's belongings.
