VICTIMS

The Palestinian youth "Mohammad Waleed Abu Hamda" 18-year-old has been killed by a shelling hit Khan Eshieh camp's outskirts yesterday, it is believed that the shelling was fired from Al-Kabousiya nearby hill where the regime's forces are positioned.

RECENT UPDATES

The AGPS' correspondent reported a bombing hit the upper floor of Al-Huda Mosque in Khan Eshieh camp, resulted in material damage and caused panic to civilian residents of the camp.



The regime's warplanes dropped four explosive barrels at least on the camp's outskirts, this incident took place while shelling sounds from Al-Kabousiya hill were heard in the region.

In another place, the Palestinian refugees who were living in Al-Diabiya town in Damascus Countryside province, as well as other activists,

demanded the so-called "Nation Reconciliation Committee" to help them get permission to go back to their homes.

It is important to note that the regime's army as well as its affiliated Palestinian armed groups are still prohibiting Palestinian residents from going to their homes for years, during which, lots of rubbery, looting and vandalism acts were committed.



The residents who were displaced to the surrounding areas as well as outside the country were left in miserable conditions as unemployment and low financial income strongly affected them. Consequently, hundreds of families were forced to live in temporary evacuation centers such as schools, in which, families are being crammed into few classrooms in inhumane circumstances.

To Turkey, where 16 Palestinian families living in Derik Camp for Syrian refugees south of the country, appealed to the humanitarian foundations to get them out of the desert camp.

The families talked to the AGPS' correspondent, said that the camp has witnessed two huge fires took place within the last week, killed four refugees including children.

The camp was described by one of the refugees as "More like a prison, surrounded by three lines of barbed wires. A place where you cannot leave without security permission or what we term as 'a leave'!".

Others complained about the low financial support which is as little as 80TL monthly, not enough to buy the food according to them.



Sources from inside the camp confirmed the spread of some diseases among refugees due to the wells water which is more likely to be contaminated, in addition to dirty bathrooms, hot weather and the spread of insects and snakes in some cases, noting that the shelters given to the refugees are not more than tents.

Palestinians from Syria in numbers and statistics Until 2 April 2016

- 15,000 Palestinian refugee from Syria in Jordan,
- 6,000 Palestinian refugees from Syria in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics of July 2015.
- More than 71,200 Palestinian refugee from Syria arrived Europe by the end of December 2015.
- Al-Yarmouk Camp: still under the siege imposed by Syrian Regime's Army and the PFLP-GC (Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command for 1022 days. Power cut for 1083 days, water cut for 572 days. The number of victims resulting from the siege is 186.
- Al-Sheina Camp: Syrian Regime's Army still preventing the residents from returning to their houses for 878 days.
- Handarat Camp: All of its residents have left the camp for 1070 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: water cut continues for 731 days. 70% of its buildings are destroyed.
- Jarmana, AL-Saieda Zainab, Al-Raml, Al-Aedein Homs and Al-Aedein camp of Hama: A relatively quiet situation with economic crises.
- Khan Eshieh Camp: All roads linking the camp to the city are still closed back and forth except for Zakia-Khan Eshieh road.
