Latest Developments

Palestinian refugee Nael Taha Mohamed Shahada, aged 26, survived an assassination attempt in AlMuzeireeb town, south of Syria, after unidentified gunmen opened fire at him in his leg. He was transferred to Daraa National Hospital for urgent treatment.

The gunmen also shot Mohamed Mahmoud AlGhanem, aged 40. No injuries were reported.

A couple of days earlier, AlMuzeireeb mayor Ahmad AlNabulsi, aged 55, survived an assassination attempt after anonymous gunmen shot him with gunfire. The mayor was evacuated to the Daraa National Hospital, before he was transferred to the Muwasat Hospital.



Over recent years, Palestinians taking shelter in AlMuzeireeb town have expressed deep concern over the security situation in the area after reports have emerged on increasing assassination attempts.

Activists have accused pro-government militias in Syria of assassinating opposition affiliates south of Syria in violation of the reconciliation accords struck between the two sides.



AGPS documented the death of 395 Palestinian refugees in Daraa province, including 56 from AlMuzeireeb town, where nearly 8,500 Palestinian refugees used to take shelter.

Along the same line, AGPS documented the death of Palestinian refugee Majed Na'imi in Syrian government prisons. The latter reportedly breathed his last on November 5, 2014.

The casualty was kidnapped by government forces from AlKashef neighborhood, in Daraa, on November 26, 2012, a couple of weeks before he was transferred to a military branch in Daraa. Sometime later, he was taken to Damascus.



On November 5, 2014, the Tishreen Military Hospital in Damascus told his family that he died five months after his detention and handed them over the death report.

AGPS documented the death of 590 Palestinian refugees due to fatal torture in Syrian state penal complexes, among them dozens of women and minors.



Meanwhile, Palestinian refugee Muayad Khaled AlHayek has been enduring a mysterious fate in Syrian state lock-ups, where he has been held for the fourth consecutive year.

Muayad was arrested on April 16, 2015, at the age of 14. Exprisoners said they last met him at the security branch in Hama.

Muayad's brother, Mohamed Khaled, died under torture in Syrian government prisons while his father has been forcibly disappeared in government penitentiaries since 2014.

In the meantime, Palestinian refugee from Syria Khaled Ra'fat Assaad, born in Syria's 2008 in Khan Eshieh Camp, won the best fiction award for 2018 granted by the Swedish News Agency.

Khaled's novel tackled the story of his migration to Sweden with his family in 2013, fleeing war-torn Syria, and the risks they had gone through in their mountainous journey.
