"Special Sources for the AGPS: Iran and Hezbollah Refused to Intervene for the Release of Palestinian Detainees in the Syrian Regime's Prisons"



- The Syrian Security Checkpoints Arrest Two Palestinians from Muzareeb Camp South of Syria

Recent Updates

Palestinian sources - who asked not to be identified - confirmed to the AGPS that a number of Palestinian factions demanded "Iran" and "Hezbollah" to intervene with the Syrian regime to release more than 1,000 Palestinian prisoners in its jails and its security branches.

The sources added that "Hezbollah" and "Iran" refused to even discuss the names of the detainees, or work on revealing their fate, as they refused to intervene to reveal the fate of "Palestinian resistance" disappeared in Syria believed to be detained.



For their part, activists confirmed to the AGPS that Iran, Hezbollah, and a number of Palestinian factions in Damascus, has strong ties with the Syrian regime, and is able to release Palestinian detainees, but they refused to intervene in the detainees file under the pretext of lack of desire to disrupt their relationship with the Syrian regime.

Documented statistics of the AGPS shows that (1086) Palestinian refugees detained in the Syrian regime's prisons.



In a different context, Syrian security forces arrested the Palestinian refugee "Amjad Kamel Fahd Hussein," 35 years, on one of the security checkpoints in the capital, Damascus. He was arrested he is from Alkharoubi clan. The Syrian security forces arrested the Palestinian refugee "Bassam Khaled Abu Shella," 42 years, on one of the regime's checkpoints in Daraa southern Syria; he is from Alqadereia clan, and the two detainees are from Muzeireeb southern Syria.



It is noteworthy that the regime's checkpoints became an obsession for the Palestinian young people, as hundreds of refugees were arrested on the checkpoints of the Syrian security, while the Syrian security reticent about their fate. The AGPS documented (1086) detainees, while 445 refugees have died due to torture.

On the other hand, the AGPS correspondent in Neirab camp in Aleppo confirmed that the child, "Ahmed Haitham Issa," and the child, "Ali Mahmoud Khalayli", were injured after they were hit by shrapnel of a mortar shell and explosive shotgun. The two children were transferred to the medical center in the camp for treatment.



It is noteworthy that Neirab location which is adjacent to the Neirab military airport made it a strategic location for the conflict parties in Syria. The camp was previously targeted with shelling and shooting, which led to casualties among civilians, and many residents were killed during participation in the events of war in Syria.

The Palestinian refugee "Moataz Bellah Abu Zamel" was injured with fractures of foot and a number of wounds by shrapnel after a mortar shell targeted a neighborhood of Damascus.

"Abu Zamel" is the Head of the Yarmouk camp Municipality in Damascus suburb.



Furthermore, hundreds of Palestinian families, who were displaced from their camps because of the shelling and the siege to Al Dukhaneya, Al Kabas, and Dwelaa areas east of the capital Damascus, are suffering of worsening economic crisis because of the spread of unemployment among them. They also cannot find place to restore, especially in light of the dramatic rise of houses' rents in addition to the many conditions imposed by homeowners in those house.



Residents demanded UNRWA, PLO, and Palestinian factions to shoulder their responsibilities towards them, and to work to bring them back to their camps, such as Husseneia, Sbeina, and Yarmouk camps.

It is noteworthy that a large number of Palestinian families have been forced to displace again in 12-9-2016 after the storming of opposition fighters into Al Dukhaneya area and impose control of the nearby neighborhoods such as Jaramana, Ein Tarma, and Al Kabas.

Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics till 2\07\2016:

- *15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan*
- *42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon*
- *6000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015*
- *8000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Turkey*
- *1000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza*
- *More than 71.2 thousand Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till the End of December 2015*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1110 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1172 days, water was cut for 661 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 964 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - All Residents have left the camp for about 1 156 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*

- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 817 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jermana, AL Saieda ZAINab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.*
