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"Tens of Yarmouk Women Demonstrate Condemning Shelling and Siege"

Recent Updates

Tens of Yarmouk women demonstrated yesterday condemning the explosive barrels shelling that targeted civilians' houses the day before yesterday, which killed a civilian and resulted in number of injuries in addition to the mass destruction of houses and properties.

Women assured their stay in Yarmouk despite the dire humanitarian conditions, while the price of bread pack has reached more than 10\$.

As well as, they demanded to end the Yarmouk siege and to provide water and power, calling on Mr. Mahmoud Abbas and the PLO delegation to enter the camp and check the besieged people condition and to take serious action in order to put an end to the camp's suffering.



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On the other hand, the residents of Sbeina camp demanded to open the road for their return to their houses, after the Syrian army and some Palestinian groups affiliated to it prevented the residents of returning back for 536 days.



Residents were forced to leave houses following violent clashes broke out between the regular army and the Syrian opposition armed groups which ended with Regular Army full control over the camp. Testimonies indicated that more than 80% of the camp were almost completely destroyed, especially the area between Moaaz Ibn Jabal mosque to Kurds bakery, the western entrance of the camp.

The suffering of displaced families is not limited at leaving their houses, but also it included all aspects of life that turned into a tragedy due to the dire economic situation, the spread of unemployment, and the lack of financial resources. Huge number of residents has migrated outside of Syria following war and dire economic conditions, as UNRWA estimations indicated that 8.12% of Sbeina Residents were displaced in



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Lebanon, out of the total number of refugees there which estimated with about 50,000 refugees.

Turning to Lebanon, Mr. Yasser Kaddoura, the General Coordinator of the International Campaign forMaintain the Palestinian Identity "Intimaa," stressed the need to lift the Yarmouk siege, to respect the Palestinian presence, and to neutralize Palestinian refugee camps of the events there. That was during his speech, the day before yesterday, while launching the campaign' activities in the Lebanese city of Sidon.



Calling on the Lebanese government and the concerned authorities to settle the Palestinian refugees from Syria, legal and humanitarian conditions to be realized when they return to their camps in Syria that make up a station on the way back to their homes in Palestine.

The International Campaign for Maintain the Palestinian Identity "Intimaa," was launched for the sixth consecutive year with a view to promoting national belonging among the Palestinian people.



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In the same context, thousands of Palestinians from occupied land in the city of Nazareth, raised banners in solidarity with the Yarmouk refugee camp, and displayed three-dimensional cale model represents the suffering of the stricken people in Yarmouk.

This came during the exit of thousands to commemorate the first of May 1958 when the people of Nazareth rose up against the Zionist occupation that prevented the commemoration of the tenth anniversary of the occupation of Palestine in conjunction with the International Workers' Day.



The Palestinians of the occupied territory had launched a solidarity campaign with the Yarmouk refugee camp under the title "in Yarmouk, My People" which included torches and marches of solidarity with the besieged and strickenpeople.

The Charity Committee for the Relief of Palestinian People resumes providing aid to the displaced residents of Yarmouk, as it distributes baby milk to the displaced children, while preparing "Al Amal" campaign which will contain 1500 baby milk cans.



Numbers and Statistics till 30/4/2015

- At least 27933 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.
- The Yarmouk Camp: Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 675 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 745 days, water was cut for 235 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 176 victims.
- 80,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees escaped from Syria to the neighboring towns, including 10,687 refugees in Jordan, 51,300 in



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Lebanon and **6,000** refugees in Egypt, according to UNRWA statistics till February 2015.

- Al Husayneyya Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 565 days respectively.
- Al Sheina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 536 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: Residents have left the camp for 738 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 382 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
