



"AGPS: 21 Palestinian-Syrians were Killed during Last December"



- People of Al-Ramadan Camp suffer from a constant state of instability.
- An infant and his mother downed and died while trying to arrive in Greece.
- The Greek Coast Guard stops 34 immigrants while trying to arrive in Greece via Aegean Sea.
- 1100 Palestinian-Syrian families in Tyre City suffer from aid shortage.



STATISTICS


The Monitoring and Documentation team in the AGPS announced that 21 Palestinian-Syrian refugees were killed during December 2015, including 13 refugees by gunshots, and 2 refugees were tortured to death in Syrian regime's prisons, while 2 others were killed due to shelling, one as a result of lack of medical care, one due to suffocation, one due to bombing, and one was kidnapped and killed later.

The AGPS pointed out that the Palestinian victims who died during the month of December belong to different Syrian cities as follows: Damascus (4) refugees, Damascus Suburb (8), Aleppo (3), Daraa (2), and (4) refugees died in scattered areas.



RECENT UPDATES

The vicinities of Al-Ramdan Camp which is located in the south-east of the city of Damascus, at a distance of approximately 50 km, and 9 km away from the city of Al-Dmier, witnesses a great security tension which reflected on people who complain about the lack of stability and safety, and continuing clashes and shelling between the regime's army and the Syrian opposition groups.

The camp's inhabitants suffer from severe crises of life, the most important ones are the spread of unemployment and the lack of food and basic materials and medicines and fuel.



GREECE

Greek Coast Guard announced yesterday, recovering the bodies of an infant and his mother who died in the sinking of the boat which was carrying them along with dozens of other migrants towards Greece.

According to a statement of Coast Guard, the local fishermen reported the sinking boat carrying 38 migrants near the coast of the island of Ogathonasa.

The statement added that a ship belonging to the organization of "Moise", which means saving immigrants, based in Malta, went to that spot, and was able to rescue 38 migrants who had succeeded to climb some rocks amid the sea, while the fishermen recovered the body of a woman and a child.

The statement said that the bodies were transferred to Pythagoreio Port on the island of Samos with ten injures have been admitted to the hospital for treatment.

It is worth mentioning that thousands of refugees from Syria travel to Greece via "Death Boats" sailing from the Turkish coast, in an attempt to access Greece and continue towards Western European countries later on.

The AGPS had pointed out earlier that the number of Palestinians-Syrian refugees who managed to arrive in Europe has exceeded 71 thousands.

TURKEY

The Turkish authorities has arrested (34) Syrian refugees while they were trying to reach Greece, according to Anadolu Agency, the Turkish Coast Guard teams conducted an operation off the coast of the state of (Aydin) in the Aegean Sea after receiving a communiqué of illegal migration attempt towards Greece.

The agency confirmed that the "Turkish Coast Guard teams had arrested 34 people of Syrian nationality and transferred them to the Immigration

Department in addition to a 14 years-old smuggler who was driving the boat.

It is noteworthy that Turkey had signed, few weeks ago, an agreement with the European Union requires in one of its paragraphs Turkey to combat illegal immigration.



LEBANON

The AGPS has received many messages from Palestinian families displaced to the city of Tyre in Lebanon, complaining about the ignorance of relief organizations and charities.

According to these families; they suffer from a very difficult situation which affects all their life aspects, at economic and social levels, and causing an insecurity state due to the volatile policies practiced by the General Security, especially in regards of not renewing the residency permits, and the arrest campaign carried out from time to time under the pretext of residency expiry, in addition to not allowing the refugees to get work permissions.

In terms of living aspect; the UNRWA's recent decision to reduce its services provided to refugees and to cut shelter aid had a mass negative impact on their living conditions.

It is noteworthy that the number of Syrian Palestinian families displaced to the city of Tyre, southern Lebanon is estimated at 1,100 family out of 42,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees fled to Lebanon to escape the war in Syria.

Palestinians of Syria in numbers and Statistics until 3 January 2016

- 15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.
- More than 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have arrived Europe during the last 4 years.
- The Yarmouk Camp: still under siege imposed by the Syrian Regime's Army and PFLP-GC (Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command), continued for 915 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 985 days, water cut for 475 days. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 184 victims.
- Al Sbeina Camp: Syrian Regime's Army still preventing the residents from returning back to their houses for 776 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: All of its residents have left the camp for 977 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.

- Dara'a Camp: Running water cut continues for 621 days, and 70% of its buildings were distroyed.
- Jarmana, AL-Saieda Zainab, Al-Raml, Al-Aedein Homs and Aedein Hama: A relatively quiet situations in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia Khan EShieh road.
