Recent Updates

The AGPS documentation and monitoring team announced that 22 Palestinian refugees died during last April, including 10 refugees died by a gunshot, 5 refugees died due to shelling, a refugee died due to torture in the Syrian Regime prisons,



a refugee was assassinated, and a refugee died by a sniper shot.

The AGPS pointed out that the Palestinian refugees who died during last April were scattered according to the Syrian cities as follows: 8 refugees died in Damascus, 6 refugees died in Damascus suburb, 3 refugees died in Deraa Camp, 4 refugees died in Aleppo, and a refugee died in a Syrian city.


According to the AGPS documented statistics, the number of Palestinian refugees who died due to the ongoing war in Syria has reached 3215 victims.

A state of tension and conflict prevailed at the Yarmouk camp south of the Syrian capital of Damascus.

The AGPS reported confirmed that shelling and violent clashes broke out in the camp during the past two days between the Regular Army alongside the affiliated Palestinian groups and Al Nusra front.

Meanwhile, clashes and sniping are still continuous between ISIS and Al Nusra, while residents confirmed that ISIS managed to impose control

over many areas was controlled by Al Nusra, which became very weak, as he described. The AGPS reported pointed put that the people of Yarmouk suffer of severe living conditions due to the lack of food, medication, and water.

Moreover, ISIS and Al Nusra were controlling almost 70% of the Yarmouk camp before they engaged in the conflict following the agreement that was signed between ISIS and the Syrian Regime which stated the withdrawal of ISIS from the southern area towards northern Syria..

Meanwhile, the Syrian regime released the Palestinian refugee, Wesam Jumaa, who is from Khan Dannon camp in Damascus suburb, yesterday, after he was detained for about a month. The Syrian security forces arrested each of Wesam Jumaa and Qasim Jarayan on 30th of April 2016, as they released Jumaa, while still detaining Jarayan.

The camp is full controlled by the Syrian Regime and its affiliated groups, while the residents suffer of the practices of Khan Dannon checkpoint's members who harassed people and confiscate their belongings while passing through the checkpoint.

In the same context, the Turkish authorities released the Palestinian refugee, Mohammed Qablawi, from Al Nairab camp after being detained for several months. He was arrested with three other refugees by the Interpol

several months ago in charges of smuggling and money transfer. According to unofficial statistic, the number of Palestinian Syrian refugees ranged from 6000-8000 refuges scattered between Istanbul and governorates of middle and south of Turkey.

In Lebanon, the Palestinians of Syria Teachers League, in cooperation with the Students' Committee of the Palestinians of Syria Committee in Lebanon, carried out an intensive course for the ninth grade students who were displaced at Nahr Al Barid camp in Tripoli city South of Lebanon, the course will include scientific materials (math-physics-chemistry-science-English).


It is noteworthy that the number of Palestinian Syrian families who were displaced at Nahr Al Bared camp south of Lebanon has reached 350 families out of 12,000 Palestinian Syrian families have fled to Lebanon in order to escape the ongoing war in Syria.



Statistics

AGPS documentation and monitoring team has documented the names of 81 Palestinian refugees who died outside of Syria, including 15 refugees

in Egypt, 21 refugees in Lebanon, 17 refugees in Libya, 8 refugees in Greece, 12 refugees in Turkey, 6 refugees in Malta, 3 refugees in Palestine, 3 refugees in Italy, 1 refugee in Sweden, 1 refugee in Syprus, 1 refugee in Macedonia, and 2 refugees in Germany.

According to the AGPS documented statistics, the number of Palestinian refugees who died till now has reached 3215 victims, some of them died due to direct reasons such as bombing, clashes, torture in the prisons, explosions, and siege, and some others died due to indirect reasons such as sank while trying to reach Europe through the so-called "Death Boats"

Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics till 03\05\2016:

- 15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan
- 42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon
- 6000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015
- 8000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Turkey
- 1000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza
- More than 71.2 thousand Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till the End of December 2015
- The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1053 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1114 days, water was cut for 603 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 186.

- Al Sbeina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 907 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: All Residents have left the camp for about 1098 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 760 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
