

Daily report on the situation of Palestinian refugees in Syria




"The Action Group: 10 Palestinian refugees died in Syria during November 2017"

- Hundreds of Palestinians in Idlib appeal to UNRWA to take its responsibility towards them
- Mortar shell falls in Deraa camp, south of Syria
- School books given to Yarmouk camp's students in Al-Jarmac's alternative school in Yelda
- Palestinian-Syrians suffer catastrophic conditions in the Lebanese Beqaa



## **Latest Developments**

AGPS's Monitoring and Documentation Team announced that 10 Palestinian refugees died during November 2017, of which 6 people died of gunshots, 3 others died of the siege and lack of medical care and one refugee died due to torture in the Syrian regime prisons.



The Action Group added that the Palestinian victims who died during November were distributed across Syria as follows: 4 refugees died in Damascus, 3 in Deir ez-Zour, 2 people died in the suburbs of Damascus and another person died in an unknown place.

The Palestinian refugees displaced from the capital, Damascus, and its suburbs, appealed to UNRWA to assume its responsibilities towards them and to provide relief and medical assistance which were provided to them in the areas they lived in, in Damascus.

They also called on the international organizations to lend them a helping hand, and called on UNRWA to provide them with relief and medical assistance, as well as education services to the children who



have been deprived of them, after being displaced from Damascus and its suburbs.

The last quarter of 2016 had seen the displacement of more than 2500 Palestinian refugees from Khan Al-Sheih camp to Idlib, north of Syria, after signing a reconciliation agreement was signed between the regime forces and the Syrian opposition groups, in addition to the thousands of Palestinian refugees who fled Yarmouk, Sabinah, Handarat and Al-Hussaineya camps.



In the south of Syria, Deraa camp for Palestinian refugees was bombarded with a mortar shell, which landed on one of the camp's neighborhoods, causing material destruction.

The remaining residents of Deraa camp and Al-Sad Road's neighborhood are complaining of harsh human conditions due to the siege imposed by the regime's army on the camp and the areas adjacent to it. They are also suffering from an extreme lack of food supplies, and the continuous water, electricity and communications cuts which last for long periods of time.



In the south of Damascus, the General Authority for Palestinian Arab Refugees introduced a collection of stationery and textbooks, provided by UNRWA to the students of Yarmouk camp in Al-Jarmac's alternative school in the neighboring town of Yelda.

Hundreds of Palestinian families had fled from Yarmouk camp for Palestinian refugees after ISIS took control of it, with the support aid of Al-Nusra Front, in April 2015.

In Lebanon, the Palestinians of Syria in the western Beqaa, which is considered one of the coldest areas in Lebanon, are suffering due to the low temperatures, the lack of financial resources and the deterioration of their difficult living conditions. The temperatures drop to 12 degrees below zero, and most of the time, snow covers the houses in the area.



On their part, the Palestinian-Syrian families displaced from Yarmouk camp to the Beqaa area in Lebanon, demanded the highlighting of their plight, and sending it to the decision makers and the concerned parties, especially UNRWA, the PLO, the Palestinian factions in Lebanon and the relief associations and organizations.



## Palestinians of Syria: December 03, 2017 Statistics:

- The total number of victims documented by the Action Group is 3615, including 463 women
- 1643 Palestinians are locked up behind Syrian government's bars, 105 of which are women
- Yarmouk refugee camp is under the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine's siege for 1,600 days in a row
- 204 refugees, mainly in Yarmouk Camp, have died due to lack of medical care and malnutrition
- Water supplies have been cut off Deraa Camp for 1337 days, and 1177 days in Yarmouk Camp
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo have been banned from their homes for 1,673 days. Government troops have taken over the camp for more than 436 days.
- Approximately 85 thousand Palestinian-Syrian refugees fled to Europe by the end of 2016
- 31 thousand refugees are located in Lebanon
- 17 thousand refugees are sheltered in Jordan
- 6 thousand refugees are in Egypt
- 8 thousand refugees are staying in Turkey
- One thousand refugees are present in Gaza
