"Humanitarian Disaster in the Yarmouk Refugee Camp and ISIS Kidnaps Dozens of the Camp's Residents"

Victims

The Refugee "Redwan Al Ahmed" died due to wounds he attained in a previous bombing at the Yarmouk Camp, and Fatah Al Intifada also declared the death of "Abdullah Hasan Abdulla" who died due to clashes at the Yarmouk Camp. The Palestinian Refugee "Majed Al Omari" from the Yarmouk camp also

died during the clashes that broke out at Yarmouk which raises the death toll, who were documented since the ISIS entrance to Yarmouk, to 7 victims.

Recent Updates

The AGPS declared that a humanitarian disaster started at the Yarmouk Camp, where there are no medical services inside the camp though there are tens of wounded people due to the bombing and the continuous clashes. The AGPS called all International Organizations particularly the ICRC to work to deliver the medical aid, to secure treatment for the wounded people, and to rescue the lives of more than 3500 children inside the camp without water or food.

On the other hand, violent clashes broke out yesterday on different fronts in the Yarmouk camp between Aknaf Bait Al Maqdis and ISIS alongside with Al Nusra front, where the ISIS members were spread on the roofs of houses near Abu Hasheesh Square amid the continuous clashes that are

concentrated on Lubiya Street. The clashes coincided with arresting and terrifying campaigns by ISIS where they kidnapped tens of youth in the camp in addition to two young women from their house at Al Madares Street. Activists insured to the AGPS that ISIS beheaded two of the PLA decedents and they found their bodies without heads in one of the camp's lanes.

ISIS groups continue to prevent the residents of reaching the water distribution points, as they remain in their houses because of the spread of snipers and the curfew. The medical services were completely stopped working at the Yarmouk camp, as the residents launched a distress calls demanding the ICRC to intervene for evacuating the wounded people and secure their treatment.

In the same context, activists reported that ISIS groups is now imposing control of over 80% of the camp's space, where violent clashes broke out in Safed Street, the vicinity of AL Basil Hospital, and Abdul Qader Al Hussini mosque. ISIS groups demanded the members of Aknaf Bait Al Maqdis to surrender themselves through the mosque's microphones but they refused and continue to clash with ISIS groups.

For its part, Aknaf Bait Al Maqdes brigades announced through the microphones of Salah Al Dein mosque south of the Yarmouk camp that the operation of restore the Yarmouk camp has begun. Mr. Abu Hammam, a leader of Aknaf brigades announced through a sound record that Aknaf brigades are still resisting inside the camp and he promised to expel ISIS groups out of the camp.

In the same context, Hamas movement called to the need to urgently intervene to rescue the Yarmouk camp for Palestinian refugees in Syria after armed groups broke into it and torture its residents.

Dr. Ismael Redwan, a leader of Hamas movement, said to "Quds Press

Newspaper" "there is a serious tragedy in the Yarmouk camp that is besieged for years, and it has to stop as soon as possible."

He also called the PA, the PLO that has a representative in Damascus, and all the concerned parties to



 $urgently\ intervene\ to\ rescue\ the\ Yarmouk\ residents.$

Dr. Redwan demanded to avoid the Palestinian camps of the internal conflicts in the Arab countries, saying: "Our battle as Palestinians are with the occupation and the Palestinian people in the Diaspora should have honor and respect. They should becared on Arab lands for they are guests on their way back to Jerusalem and to Palestine."

He added: "We have to stop the massacres committed against our people in the besiegedYarmouk refugee camp and all parties should bear the



responsibilities; he added that the Palestinian refugee camps are the title of the Palestinian refugees' issue and targeting them is targeting of the Palestinian cause.

Numbers and Statistics till 3/4/2015

- At least 27933 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.
- The Yarmouk Camp: Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 636 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 716 days, water was cut for 206 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 173 victims.
- 80,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees escaped from Syria to the neighboring towns, including 10,687 refugees in Jordan, 51,300 in Lebanon and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to UNRWA statistics till February 2015.
- Al Husayneyya Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 537 days respectively.
- Al Sheina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 507 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: Residents have left the camp for 709 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 353 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.
