Latest Developments

AGPS on Tuesday embarked on a so-called "This Is My Story" campaign to document testimonies by the Palestinian survivors of the Syrian warfare, both in Syria and overseas.

Researchers and academics from Syria, Lebanon, Jordan, Turkey, Europe, Canada, and the U.S. will be involved in the campaign as part of underway efforts to collect testimonies from Palestinian-Syrian refugees who have sought asylum across the globe over the past six years.

Chronicles on the "death boats" and the life-threatening journeys to Europe, along with success stories achieved in such new destinations as Lebanon, Turkey, Jordan, Sweden, the Netherlands, Denmark, Austria, the U.K., and Canada, will be released to the public.

The campaign makes use of several documentation mechanisms and devices, including live and written interviews, video records, audiotapes, and sworn affidavits.

The campaign makes part of AGPS incessant endeavors to keep record of the tragedy endured by the Palestinians of Syria.

Meanwhile, ISIS militias on Tuesday closed off the main access road between Al-Kadam area and the Yarmouk Camp, in southern Damascus province, via sand barriers.

Recently, ISIS crackdowns on Yarmouk residents, particularly those sheltered in Ein Al-Ghazal neighborhood, have reached a zenith.



Yarmouk residents have also been grappling with a tough siege slapped by the Syrian army and the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine-General Command (PFLP-GC). Water and power supplies to the shelter have also been subjected to chronic outages.

In a related development, road traffic is expected to go back to normal after the Al-Neirab Municipality on Tuesday removed sand barriers erected on the main entrance to the Al-Neirab Camp.



The Al-Neirab Camp is controlled from all sides by the regime army and their Palestinian abettors.

Meanwhile, according to AGPS statistics, 15 Palestinians from Syria have gone missing in 2016, four among whom from Rural Damascus and four others From Al-Suweida province. Two other refugees disappeared from Damascus, two from Aleppo, and another from Deraa. Two Palestinian refugees have also gone missing in unidentified Syrian provinces and another in the Turkish city of Istanbul.

300 Palestinians from Syria have gone missing since the outburst of bloody hostilities, AGPS found out.

Palestinians of Syria: January 4, 2017 Statistics:

• At least 3,416 Palestinians, including 455 women, were killed in wartorn Syria.

- 1,137 Palestinian refugees, including 80 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.
- Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,295 days in a row.
- 190 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.
- Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 999 and 814 days.
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,341 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 77 days.
- Government troops ban residents of Al-Sbiena Camp from returning to their homes for 1,148 days running.
- Over 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.
- 31,000 Palestinians are housed in Lebanon.
- 17 Palestinians are taking refuge in Jordan.
- 6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.
- 8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.
- 1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.
