VICTIMS

The Palestinian-Syrian refugee "Mohammad Awad Ukla" was killed in battles of Shiekh Miskeen Town in Dar'a, knowing that he was a pro-regime fighter and a member of some popular militias, Mohammad used to live in Khan Eshieh Camp.



AGPS

The AGPS assured in a press release, issued yesterday's morning, that more than one-third of the Palestinian Syrian refugees living in Syria, who count around half million, were displaced towards out of Syria, due to the war and targeting their homes by shelling and siege or clashes, causing dispersing them to almost all continents across the world.

AGPS mentioned that, this issue will be discussed in details in its next report entitled "Palestinians of Syria.. Refugees across life milestones".

The statement mentioned that, more than 71.200 refugees have already arrived Europe as all of the neighbouring countries didn't allow them to take refuge, adding that "the report will shed light on all aspects of this



issue in terms of human rights conditions, and will go deep into indicators of population, economy, and human rights violations".



RECENT UPDATES

For the third day, the entrance of Al-Nayrab Camp was exposed to shelling, specifically at the arch point. Damages were limited to materials.

It is noteworthy that the camp is still under control of the Assad's regime and its militias, which turned the camp into "military barracks" according to activists, and pushed hundreds of civilians to immigrate fearing of obligatory military conscription.

In Homs camp, or Al-Aydeen camp of Homs City, the Syrian Security has released the PS refugee "Hisham Shanati" after being arrested for about six months in its prisons. AGPS assures that 86 civilians at least from the same camp are still under arrest until now, and the total amount of detainees is has become 1049.



Moving to London, the Action Group for the Palestinians of Syria, alongside with the Palestinian Return Centre have sent a memo the "Syria Donors Conference" held yesterday in London, reviewing the suffering of the PS refugees inside and outside Syria, and demanding to include them in relief programs funded and adopted by the conference.

The memo included a brief explanation about the economic and legal conditions of refugees in Syria, Lebanon, Jordan and Turkey, accompanied by statistical view depending on official and local census.



The mentioned memo, signed by Mr. Majed Al-Zeer, chairman of the PRC London, demanded to treat the PS refugees according to the regulations of International Law and to secure them decent life until returning back to their homeland in Palestine.

It is noteworthy that the conference was initiated by British Prime Minister David Cameron, in London, in presence of seventy countries leaders and representatives from the United Nations and the European Union.



Palestinians of Syria in numbers and Statistics until 4 February 2016

- *15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 42,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.*
- *More than 71,200 Palestinian Syrian refugees have arrived Europe until the end of December 2015.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: still under siege imposed by the Syrian Regime's Army and PFLP-GC (Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine – General Command), continued for 964 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 1026 days, water cut for 513 days. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 185 victims .*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: Syrian Regime's Army still preventing the residents from returning back to their houses for 820 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: All of its residents have left the camp for 1013 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: Running water cut continues for 674 days, and 70% of its buildings were destroyed.*
- *Jarmana, AL-SaiedaZainab, Al-Raml, Al-Aedein Homs and AedeinHama: A relatively quiet situations in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia-Khan EShieh road.*
