Latest Developments

ISIS ordered all civilians in Yarmouk Camp for Palestinian refugees, south of Damascus, to evacuate their homes.

Reporting from the area, AGPS field correspondent said ISIS forced civilians out of their homes near Abdul Kadir AlHusseini Mosque and Haifa Street after they declared the area an ISIS-run military zone.

The move has not been the only one of its kind. Upon several earlier occasions, civilian families have been ordered by ISIS to depart their homes in Haifa Street, Jadat, and AlMadaris under the same pretext.



Civilians trapped in Yarmouk have often launched cries for help over the crackdowns perpetrated by ISIS ever since they held sway over the camp on April 1, 2015.

Meanwhile, dozens of Palestinian families deported from Khan AlSheih Camp, in Rif Dimashq, to Idlib have sounded distress signals over their dire conditions.



The displaced families appealed to UNRWA to take urgent action as regards the tragic humanitarian situation endured by hundreds of women and children in the area. The families said they have received neither relief nor cash aids from UNRWA.

Some 2,500 families were forcibly deported from Khan AlSheih Camp to the northern Syrian province of Idlib on November 28, 2016, following a reconciliation deal struck between the Syrian government and the opposition.

Along the same line, several Palestinian families displaced from Yarmouk Camp and AlHajar AlAswad to Nahr Eishiya neighborhood, in Damascus, risk to go homeless after the Syrian government forces, who regained control of the area, ordered the families to evacuate the homes. Several are likely to remain without roofs over their heads as a result of the mass-evacuation sweep.





Palestinian families flocked to Nahr Eishiya and took a provisional cover in a number of evacuated homes after the government forces tightened grip on Yarmouk Camp.

The displaced families called on all concerned parties to urgently step in and work on granting them a safe access to their homes in besieged Yarmouk Camp. They further appealed to the Palestinian Authority and UNRWA to work on providing them with provisional shelters and rental allowances until the crisis is worked out.

Arrests

AGPS documented the arrest and detention of 48 Palestinian refugees across the ravaged Syrian territories during the second half of 2016. The list included 13 arrestees from Khan AlSheih Camp and 11 from Hums-based AlAydeen Camp.

75-year-old woman Umm Omar Amsheh, a resident of Yarmouk, was arrested on September 27, 2016, as she passed through the government-run al-Kadam checkpoint, in Rif Dimashq. 20-year-old Palestinian university student Rawand Abu AlSou'oud, from AlMuzeireeb, was detained for 10 days on her way to the campus.

Several Palestinian refugees were also arrested by the opposition outfits in Syria. Refugee Faysal AlKhaled was arrested by Sham AlRasoul brigade on September 9, 2016, at the Yalda checkpoint, in Rif Dimashq. The detainee is the director of the Palestine Hospital and the Red Crescent chief in the southern area.



Palestinian refugees Omar Suleiman, Khaled Suleiman, Ammar Aziz, and Khaled Hussein, were kidnapped by ISIS militias from Rajm al-Baqar area, in AlSweida's northeastern outskirts, south of Syria, on their way to Turkey.

Civil Action Commissions

The Palestine Charity Commission, in partnership with the Syrian Society for Social Development, distributed on Monday underwear to 600 Palestinian families sheltered in Yafa youth center in Qudsaya.

The charity announced the forthcoming launch of its Fifth Medical Week for Yarmouk's displaced community in Yalda town, south of Damascus.



Palestinians of Syria: April 4, 2017 Statistics:

- *At least 3,476 Palestinians, including 455 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*



- *1,183 Palestinian refugees, including 86 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*
- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,382 days in a row.*
- *195 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.*
- *Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,088 and 896 days.*
- *Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,432 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 166 days.*
- *Over 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.*
- *31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.*
- *17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.*
- *6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.*
- *8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.*
- *1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.*
