

Victims

AlSa'ika battalion announced on its Facebook page the death of Youssef Khaled Subh, a resident of AlSayeda Zeinab Camp, as he fought alongside the Syrian government forces in Daraa, south of Syria.


AGPS documented the death of 3,524 Palestinian refugees in war-torn Syria.



Latest Developments

According to AGPS data, 3,524 Palestinian refugees were killed in the raging Syrian warfare.

Shelling took away the lives of 1,146 Palestinians. 885 others were killed in bloody hostilities between the regime army and the opposition outfits. At the same time, 463 Palestinians died under torture in Syrian government penitentiaries.

Lists of killed or missing refugees are available on AGPS website: actionpal.org.uk. AGPS supplies a database of their names and possible times and places of their death.

In a related development, a newly-released Palestinian woman said she had last met the Palestinian female detainee Faten Mohamed AlSoutari in the Syrian Air Force Intelligence building in February 2017.

AGPS documented the incarceration of 100 Palestinian women and girls in Syrian government jails.

The list of detainees included students, activists, and civilians who were kidnapped at checkpoints pitched across the Syrian territories.

Meanwhile, Daraa Camp and AlMzeirib community, south of Syria, have run out of life-saving medical supplies and emergency items. Most of the local clinics and hospitals have gone out of operation due to the deadly onslaughts rocking the area.

Frequent closures and cordons enforced on the main access roads out of and into the area, along with the unabated clashes, have added bad to worse.

Over recent weeks, Daraa Camp has been targeted by barrel bombs, missiles, and mortars.

In the meantime, Palestinian families seeking refuge in Qudsaya town, in Rif Dimashq, have launched cries for help over their exacerbated situation due to the price hike, high unemployment rates, steep rental fees, and the decline in civilians' purchasing power.

The situation has gone far worse due to the tough cordon imposed by the government forces on the main thoroughfares linking Qudsaya to Damascus city center has, preventing civilians from fetching muchneeded bread loafs and fuel supplies.

Qudsaya is home to thousands of families who had mostly been displaced from besieged Yarmouk Camp.

Palestinians of Syria: July 04, 2017 Statistics:

- At least 3,524 Palestinians, including 463 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.
- 1,613 Palestinian refugees, including 100 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.
- Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,441 days in a row.

- 196 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.
- Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,177 and 1,028 days.
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,521 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 255 days.
- Nearly 85,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until the end of 2016.
- 31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.
- 17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.
- 6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.
- 8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.
- 1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.
