***"Warplanes Target the Outskirts of Khan Al Shieh Camp and
Mortar Tanks Target Neirab Camp"***

Victims

The Palestinian refugee, Mohammed Ali Mansour, a PLA member, died at Housh Alfarra Town in the Eastern Ghouta due to the ongoing clashes that broke out between the Syrian armed opposition groups and the regular army alongside with the PLA and other popular Committees.



Recent Updates

Warplanes targeted the outskirts of Khan Al Shieh camp in Damascus suburb and the adjacent farms and areas. The AGPS correspondent reported that warplanes implemented more than 6 raids that targeted the eastern outskirts of Khan Al Shieh camp and the adjacent farms, which resulted in a great damage in properties and houses.





This comes amid the escalated frequent shelling that target the camp and its vicinity with all kinds of heavy weapons, artillery, and air shelling that target the area repeatedly. Adjacent farms and areas are targeted in a daily basis with explosive barrels and artillery shells.

Meanwhile, the AGPS correspondent reported that three shells targeted Neirab camp, two of them targeted the main road and the other was dropped near the cultural center with no injuries among civilians.

The location of Neirab camp which is adjacent to the Neirab Military Airport has formed a strategic location for the conflict parties in Syria, while the camp was targeted previously with shelling and shooting which resulted in deaths among civilians. Many of its residents were killed due to participating in the war events in Syria.

On the other hand, residents of the Yarmouk and Deraa camps are suffering of water cut; forcing them to rely on artesian wells, regardless of suitability for use, since well water has become the only option available for the people of the two camps.

For their part, experts confirmed to the AGPS that some of those wells may cause kidney diseases, especially with the continuous use for long periods, as it contains high percentage of sediment and not subjected to any kind of health treatment.

It is noteworthy that the Syrian regime cut off drinking water in the Yarmouk camp for more than (693) days and in Deraa camp for over 847 days.



In Lebanon, Palestinians of Syria participated in the sit-it that was organized in front of the UNRWA's Director Office in Bedawi camp in Tripoli, northern Lebanon, in a rejection of the UNRWA decreasing of its services in all aspects (medical, health, and relief). A number of civil and civic associations and a group of Bedawi residents participated in the sit-in.

It is worth mentioning that the number of Palestinian Syrian families living in Bedawi camp has reached 850 families out of about 12,000 Palestinian Syrian families who fled to Lebanon to escape the war in Syria.



Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics till 4/08/2016:

- *15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan*
- *42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon*
- *6000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015*
- *8000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Turkey*
- *1000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza*



- *More than 71.2 thousand Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till the End of December 2015*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1143 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1204 days, water was cut for 693 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 996 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - All Residents have left the camp for about 1 188 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 849 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jermana, AL Saieda Zainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.*
