Recent Updates

The AGPS announced, for all Palestinian Syrians, that they can report victims, detainees, and missing people through its website:

http://www.actionpal.org.uk/en/reported_victim.php

The website includes all the information needed for reporting, while the AGPS has documented information about 2598 Palestinian Syrian victims who died during the war, it also documented 732 detainees and 266 missing people, so the AGPS requests the families of the victims, detainees, and missing people to provide it with the available information they have.

It is noted that the AGPS translates every available statistics it has into the English language, and present it to the official and international human rights bodies and organizations to define the suffering of the Palestinian Syrian refugees.

In a related context, the statistics, which is published at the AGPS website "http://www.actionpal.org.uk/en", indicated that the number of detained people, who were documented by the AGPS, has reached 732, as the first arrest campaign, at the ongoing events, has begun at August 2011, where dozens of Palestinians from Al Raml camp were arrested at Al Lathaqia city, and many of them died due to torture.

After that, the pace of arrest campaign has been raised after the tension in the adjacent areas at the Yarmouk camp and after the camp was involved at the war to testify mass arrests followed by detentions coincided with the disclosure of the names of detainees who were killed under torture.

Similar arrests were carried out at Homs camp, which reached 132 detainees, as the AGPS documented similar arrests in a number of Syrian camps and governorates, and were reported as follow: 227 at Damascus and its suburb, 123 unknown, 102 at Aleppo, 72 at Lathaqia, 39 at Hama, 34 at Daraa, and 2 at Tartous, as the continuous arrest campaign and the victims of torture included media, relief, political and military personnel.

In addition to the civilians, the majority of these campaign, which also included the schools and universities students and were not limited at the

refugee youth it also included women, while the AGPS documented the names of 23 Palestinian refugee women who are detained at the Syrian prisons.

On the other hand, the Yarmouk camp witnessed a failed assassination attempt which targeted a leader of "Aknaf Bait Al MAqdis" brigades "Nidal Abu Al Ila" known as "Abut Hammam", after planting an explosive bomb near his house and resulted in material damages. It is mentioned that the assassination campaign is still continue at the Yarmouk camp, the last one was "Qasim Tirawi". Fatah Secretary General and the relief activist "Mohammed Arisha" at last December.

While any party did not adopt the assassination campaigns in addition to in addition to the lack of investigations and follow-ups for identifying those parties and were registered against unknown, but a lot of activists think that that the gun that commit such assassinations are hired and suspicious and seek to sabotage any reconciliation agreement, because the common denominator among the targeted figures is that they seek and adopt reconciliation approach and they attempt to bring about an agreement in the camp such as other areas, and that will end the suffering of 20 thousand besieged person inside the Yarmouk camp for 548 days respectively.

In another hand, the remain medical cadres inside the camp are working, with volunteer efforts, to fill the significant lack of ambulatory and nursing teams of paramedics and trainers, which was caused by the siege that prevent the entry of teams, people and medical supplies

The PRC is working on top of those cadres, since it previously qualified a number of medical staff, and announced in the new year, that it will start a course of rehabilitation first aid coaches in the auditorium in Palestine hospital, the only in the camp, which works with its minimum capacity

This comes in light of news about the infection of a mother and her child with jaundice due to the lack of the necessary treatments for it, which threatens the prevalence of chronic diseases and epidemics among the people of the camp and repeated death scenario of starvation and lack of medical care, if they continued the siege, which killed 158 people since the beginning of the siege on the camp.

It is noteworthy that the medical and emergency teams seek with vigorous and voluntary efforts to mitigate the effects and consequences of diseases, and has several children and adult vaccination campaigns, as well as health awareness campaigns among the parts of the camp, as well as water sterilization campaigns, which included most of the camp areas.

In Damascus Suburb, the Group's correspondent in Khan Al Sheih camp for Palestinian Refugees insured that there are indicators of bread crises that appeared in the camp due to the strict procedures of the Regular Army checkpoint in Kawkab town on the entry of bread to the camp where it didn't allow any but 8 loaves with each person. It is mentioned that all the roads that connect the camp with other areas are closed since several months except for Zakia Road in Khan Al Sheih.

In a different context, the Regular Army and the Palestinian groups loyal to the Army continue to prevent the residents of Al Husaeneyya and Al

Sbeina camps to return back to their houses without giving clear reasons where the Syrian Regime imposed its full control on the camps after violent clashes that broke out between the Regular army and the Free army where it finished with the full control of the Regular army over Al Husaeyneyya camp on October 2013 and Al Sbeina camp on November 2013.

The Palestinian Camps in Syria, Numbers and Statistics till 4/1/2015

- At least 27933 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.
- 2598 Palestinian refugees were documented by the AGPS including 157 women, 286 were killed due to torture, 267 were killed by sniper shot, 84 refugees were field executed, and 985 refugees were killed due to bombing.
- The Yarmouk Camp: Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 548 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 628 days, water was cut for 118 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached 158 victims.
- 80,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees escaped from Syria to the neighboring towns, including 14348 refugees in Jordan, 42,000 in Lebanon, according to UNRWA statistics till November 2014.
- Al Husayneyya Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 450 days respectively.
- Al Sbeina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 420 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: Residents have left the camp for 621 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 265 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Ca mps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
