#### **Victims**

The Palestinian Fatah Al-Intifada Movement Funeral the First Lieutenant, Ali Abdulrahman Mousa, Abu Hasan, was born in 1979, died due to the ongoing conflict in Syria. The movement confirmed that Mr. Mousa is one of its members in Jaramana camp, as he is married and has one child.



#### Recent Updates

Sporadic clashes broke out in the Yarmouk camp between Palestinian armed groups, and "ISIS" Alongside Al-Nusra Front, with no significant progress for both parties, while "ISIS" still controls 60% of the camp, and the regular army and armed groups control 40%.

In terms of living aspect, the remaining residents suffer from tragic situations as a result of lack of food and the continuation of water and power cut all over the camp for more than a year and a half.

In the meantime, residents of Khan Al Shieh camp in Damascus suburb suffer of low medical potential and services, which does not cover all families which are 2,000 families.

The AGPS correspondent reported that: "There are two health centers, one of them of UNRWA and the other of the Syrian government and both lacked equipment, medicines, and doctors, while there only five pharmacies in the camp that serve all families. Those pharmacies lack to most drugs, in addition to high prices due to the recent increase in the prices of medicines by the Syrian regime by 50%, as there is any doctor but a dentist, and Women and Female doctor treating all cases."

The camp lacks to medical points or field hospital for emergency where residents have to get treatment out of the camp, note that the Syrian regime arrested a resident after leaving the camp or treatment, while his fate in unknown yet.

It is noteworthy that the regular army checkpoints continue closing all connecting roads between the camp and the center of the capital Damascus, forcing people to take the dangerous sub-road (Khan Al Shieh - Zakya) to get to Damascus, where they are targeting the road frequently with shells and heavy machine guns. The AGPS documented 141 victims mostly died by shelling.

In Damascus suburb, about (6000) Palestinian families displaced from the Palestinian refugee camps, especially Yarmouk camp, and living in Qudseya district in Damascus suburb, are still suffering due to the siege imposed on Qudseya by the regular army since last July.

The siege reflected negatively on the situation of refugees and their harsh living conditions, where the city markets have a few goods and high prices, in addition to exploiting the conditions of the siege by some homeowners and raise their homes rent.

Due to the siege, any Palestinian is prevented to leave or enter the camp unless he is an employee.



The entry of any kind of goods are prevented but by royalty paid to members of the security checkpoints, and the spread of unemployment and the loss of financial resources turned the life of Palestinian refugees in Qudseya into hell, according to a resident.

It is noteworthy that the reconciliation agreement took place between the people and the Syrian regime, where it was agreed to end armed manifestations and the return of safety and security to the region. Flour, vegetables, and gas were entered and the road is to open and normalcy of life returns later, but so far siege still continues.

#### Greece

According to Greek ports police, four migrants, including two children, drowned in the Aegean Sea on Tuesday, after they fallen from on board a boat carrying them to Greece off the coast of the Greek island of Lesbos.

Police said that Greek Coast patrols and patrols belonging to the agency responsible for monitoring the European border, "Frontex," recovered the bodies of four people, while they previously managed to rescue four other immigrants, including a child were missing, while 42 migrants were on the same boat were rescued and transferred to the island.

Media sources reported that the boat, which was carrying migrants sailed from the coast of Turkey, has faced difficulties which led to the fall of eight passengers into the sea.

The 21 migrants died a few days ago after two boats were carrying refugees from Turkey to Greece sank at night east of the Aegean Sea, while hundreds were rescued amid continued influx of immigrants, especially Palestinians and Syrians.

#### Malaysia

Malaysian authorities continues detaining the Palestinian refugee "Ibrahim Abu Kharej" in the Kuala Lumpur airport for more than two months, as he appealed earlier to the Palestinian Authority, the PLO, the Palestinian Embassy in Malaysia, human rights organizations, and organizations of the United Nations for urgent action to release him, at the



same time he warned of the intention of the Malaysian authorities to deport him to Syria or Lebanon, which may pose a risk to his life.

It is noteworthy that he was arrested by the Cambodian authorities, who deported him to Malaysia, during an attempt to reach Europe.

#### **Statistics**

The AGPS monitoring and documentation team revealed that the Syrian Security has arrested six Palestinians refugees, including a woman in last October. The detainees are "Khaled Jamal Zawawi" from Muzeireeb compound south of Daraa, who was arrested by the popular committees of the Syrian security forces on 06/10/2015 in Lajat area between the provinces of Daraa and Swaidaa southern Syria, during his trip to Turkey.

The refugee "Ahmed Khaled Tahimr" who was arrested by Syrian security services on 07.10.2015 from Qamishli Airport, during his attempt to reach Turkey.

The refugee "Rami Mohammed Fahd" an engineer from Khan Al Shieh camp was arrested by Syrian security forces during his trip to Turkey in Aleppo suburb, while his fate is still unknown since the moment of his arrest.

The refugee "Walid Abdul Ghaffar" from Khan Dannun camp was arrested on 16/10 by the Syrian security forces while returning from his work, as he wastaken to an unknown destination.


The refugee" Souad Sabri Musleh" was arrested by members of Koukab checkpoint on 10.29.2015 while returning to her home in Khan Al Shieh camp.

Furthermore arrested refugee "Qasim Al Rayyan" from the Yarmouk camp, was arrested by Syrian security forces at Naher Aisha checkpoint in the capital Damascus, and was transferred to an unknown location.

It is noteworthy that the AGPS documented 990 Palestinian prisoners in the prisons of the Syrian regime, including 61 detained women, while the toll of torture victims in the prisons of the Syrian regime is 423 refugees.

#### Numbers and Statistics till 4/11/2015

• 15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.

- At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.
- The Yarmouk Camp: Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 856 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 926 days, water was cut for 416 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 182 victims.
- Al Sbeina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 717 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: Residents have left the camp for 918 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 562 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jarmana, AL Saieda Zainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Shieh road.
