



## الخاص بأوضاع اللاجئين الفلسطينيين في سورية

Daily report on the situation of Palestinian refugees in Syria



"After two weeks of its closure... the Syrian opposition factions open the Yelda/Yarmouk crossing for two hours daily and allows the movement of students and relief workers through it"

- Member of the Palestine Liberation Army dies under torture of the Syrian security
- Severe shortage of medical services in Deraa refugee camp amid continued water and electricity cuts
- The Palestinians in Syria Relief and Development Association organizes mass weddings in four Syrian governorates



#### **Victims**

AGPS's reporter in the Damascus suburbs confirmed the death of Palestinian "Saleh Fathy Ahmed Saleh," one of the ranks in the Palestine Liberation Army, under torture by members of the Syrian security forces and the groups affiliated to it, in the Khan Dannoun camp for Palestinian refugees in the suburbs of Damascus.



Our reporter added that security forces at the Khan Dannoun camp checkpoint arrested Saleh after a fight between him and the forces standing at the checkpoint, after which he was detained for a day and night. During his detention he was beaten to death.


Our correspondent pointed out that the Syrian security forces handed over his body to Al-Amani Hospital in cladding. The Hospital then handed the body to his family and his funeral took off from Khan Dannoun camp with the participation of dozens of Palestinian refugees in a state of anger and resentment.



### **Latest Developments**

Yesterday, the opposition factions allowed residents of Yarmouk camp through the Yelda/Yarmouk crossing for two hours. The crossing witnessed intensive movement by the residents.

According to our correspondent, the opening of the crossing came after efforts exerted by the Palestinian institutions operating in Yelda, through its contact with the opposition factions in the town. The armed opposition groups in Yelda announced that it will allow students of Yarmouk camp, Al-Hajar Al-Aswad and Al-Tadamon access to their schools in the three towns controlled by the opposition, while workers in the relief field were also allowed to move.



This comes after the living conditions in the camp have been severely constrained by the closure of the crossing between Yarmouk camp and Yelda for approximately two weeks, after violent clashes broke out between ISIS and the armed Syrian opposition groups.



In another context, hundreds of Palestinian families in Deraa camp are suffering from a severe shortage of medical services, where there is no medical point inside the camp, in addition to the continued closure of UNRWA's clinic in the camp for several years, under the pretext of the tense security situation, aggravating the suffering of the residents.

The residents were deprived of access to any medical services, including emergency services, as well as the basic check ups and other basic services.

In addition, the water cuts from the houses of the camp has reached 1308 consecutive days, in conjunction with a power outage, compounding the difficulties of securing water through artesian wells.

This comes in light of the security tension witnessed by the camp and its neighboring areas, due to ISIS's attacks on the region and the intermittent bombardments by the regime forces using missiles and machineguns.

#### **Local Work Committees**

The Palestinians in Syria Relief and Development Association organized four mass weddings for 100 of Palestine and Syria's youth, in four Syrian governorates on 3-11-2017.

The weddings, which were held under the title "From Pain to Hope," included 34 of Yelda's youth, 42 from Atma village in north Aleppo and 24 from Aazaz city in Aleppo in Deraa governorate.



The wedding, which was attended by hundreds of the area's residents, included religious and heritage songs and speeches by organizers of the ceremony and some public figures.



The mass wedding is the greatest since the outbreak of war of Syria, which was held with the support of the Turkiye Diyanet Foundation, Turkish IHH and other organizations that contributed to the support of the grooms, providing the expenses of marriage and their requirements for the beginning of their marriage lives.

## Palestinians of Syria: November 4, 2017 Statistics

- The total number of victims documented by the Action Group is 3606, including 462 women
- 1640 Palestinians are locked up behind Syrian government's bars, 105 of which are women
- Yarmouk refugee camp is under the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine's siege for 1,571 days in a row



- 201 refugees, mainly in Yarmouk Camp, have died due to lack of medical care and malnutrition
- Water supplies have been cut off Deraa Camp for 1308 days, and 1148 days in YarmouknCamp
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo have been banned from their homes for 1,644 days. Government troops have taken over the camp for more than 395 days.
- Approximately 85 thousand Palestinian-Syrian refugees fled to Europe by the end of 2016
- 31 thousand refugees are located in Lebanon
- 17 thousand refugees are sheltered in Jordan
- 6 thousand refugees are in Egypt
- 8 thousand refugees are staying in Turkey
- One thousand refugees are present in Gaza
