Victims

The two soldiers; Mahmoud Al Khateib and Ahmed Mohammed Kariem from the PLA died due to the ongoing conflict in Syria, raising the PLA victims' toll, which were documented by the AGPS, to 103 victims, most of them died due to military operations in Damascus suburb. It is mentioned that hundreds of Palestinian young men refuse to join the compulsory military service for fear of being involved in the ongoing war in Syria, forcing most of them to leave Syria for fear of being arrested.

Meanwhile, the Palestinian refugee Khamis Mohammed Jaber died during the ongoing battles between the Syrian Army alongside with the Palestinian groups loyal to it and the Syrian armed opposition groups at Al Manashir area in Aleppo. Mr. Jabir is from Al Raml camp in Lathakeia and he is a member of the so-called Al Quds brigades, that is fight alongside with Syrian army at many areas in Aleppo and Lathakeia, as it recruit dozens of Palestinian refugees at Al Nairab and Al Raml camps.

Recent Updates

The AGPS documentary and monitoring team confirmed that the victims toll of the strict siege that is imposed by the regular army and the PFGC groups at the Yarmouk camp, reached 165 victims, who were died due to the lack of medical care and malnutrition. The group also indicated, in its statistics that were publishes this morning, that the camp is besieged for



578 days, the power cut for more than 658 days, and the water cut for 148 days respectively.

It is mentioned that all bakeries, clinics, and hospitals were completely stopped working, except for Palestine hospital that works with its minimum capacity.

On the other hand, the warplanes targeted the vicinity of Al Salam highway near Khan Al Shieh camp in Damascus suburb with two explosive barrels, coincided with voices of heavy artillery shelling that targeted the same area, causing a state of panic among the residents fearing of being targeted as happened before during the last months. Meanwhile, the residents still complain from the living situation, especially after the continuous closure of all roads that link the camp with the adjacent areas, except for Zakia-Khan AL Shieh road.

In Thailand, the Palestinian refugees are still suffering, as a number of detainees renewed their appeal to the international and human rights organizations, the Palestinian embassy, the PLO, and Amnesty International to intervene urgently and immediately for their release. It is mentioned that the detained group include a number of Palestinians of Syria, Iraq, and Gaza, who launched a distress call previously.

One of the detainees- who preferred not to mention his name- mentioned to the group previously that he and other 5 young men from the Palestinians of Syria, who fled the hell of the ongoing war in Syria, in



addition to an old man and his son from Gaza, and a young man from the Palestinians of Iraq were arrested about a year ago in charges of expired visa. He added, "After our visas expired, we tried to travel to the Cambodian borders, so as to renew it but that did not happen, and during our presence in Bangkok we were arrested on charges of expired visa."

The AGPS appeals all human rights organizations, official Palestinian and Arab Organizations, and the Thai authorities to work on the release of Palestinian refugees who are detained in Thailand and to treat them according to the international laws and norms that ensure the dignity and the rights of the refugees of the war.

In Sweden, "Save the Palestinians of Syria" campaign announced a number of solidarity events with the Palestinians of Syria in general and the people of the Yarmouk refugee camp in particular, which contain solidarity set-ins in Vigo city square next Saturday, and another one in Malmo city next Sunday.

In Denmark, the Palestinian community and a number of the Yarmouk residents called for a solidarity sit-in with the besieged people of the Yarmouk camp in Syria at Odense square next Sunday between 3:00 to 5:00 pm.



Civil Work Committees

Jafra Organization for Relief and Development distributed water on the Yarmouk camp residents as to alleviate the suffering of the besieged Palestinian residents of the Yarmouk camp. The water cut continues on the Yarmouk houses for about 148 days respectively. The Services Department of Jafra Organization continues in a campaign to clean the streets of the camp from garbage and bombing rebels within its efforts to stop the spread of Epidemics and diseases.



Numbers and Statistics till 4/2/2015

- At least **27933** Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.
- **2632** Palestinian refugees were documented by the AGPS.
- **The Yarmouk Camp:** - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for **578** days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than **657** days, water was cut for **148** days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached **165** victims.
- **80,000** Palestinian Syrian refugees escaped from Syria to the neighboring towns, including **14348** refugees in Jordan, **42,000** in Lebanon, according to UNRWA statistics till November.
- **Al Husayneyya Camp:** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for **480** days respectively.
- **Al Sbeina Camp:** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for **449** days respectively.



- **Handarat Camp:** - Residents have left the camp for **651** days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- **Dara'a Camp:** - It is now almost **295** days without water and **70%** of its buildings were demolished.
- **Jermana, AL Saieda Zainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma:** - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- **Khan Al Sheih Camp:** - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
