"Syrian Regime remains reticent on 1000+ PRS detainees' fate"

RECENT UPDATES

Despite the continuous demanding to reveal their fate, the Syrian Regime remain reticent about more than thousand detainees of PRS including women and children and the elderly, in addition to entire families, many of which had been tortured to death.



The AGPS has taken on the responsibility of documenting all cases of arrest, the process which encounters huge difficulties either in approaching the cases in the field or in validating them, given that the families of detainees most likely to be scared of talking about their sons to media or human rights institutions and not willing to get exposed to "regime's revenge" as they say. However, the AGPS through its correspondents' network and testimonies of recently-released prisoners managed to document 1061 arrestees so far, from almost all the Palestinian Camps and compounds in Syria, as follows:

186 from Al-Aydeen Camp of Homs, 141 from Al-Yarmouk Camp, 107 from Khan Eshieh Camp, 86 from Al-Nayrab Camp, 78 from Al-Raml Camp, 53 from Hama Camp, and 410 from the rest of camps.

It is noteworthy that Palestinian arrestees are being subjected to torture and different kinds of violations as 435 PRS were tortured to death, 77 of

them were recognized throughout inspecting the photos of torture victims leaked from regime's prisons in 2015, while other testimonies of recently-released prisoners confirmed that few female prisoners have their infants with them inside the jail.

In a different topic, the regime's army continues preventing people of the Sbiena camp from returning back to their homes for the day 850, noting that they were expelled out of their houses after long and violent clashes between the regime and the opposition forces ended up by regime imposing full control over the area and evacuating its residents.

Moving to Germany, where the Palestinian refugee from Syria "Bahi Saleem Abu Hassan" has won the third place in the national contest of young scientists in Germany in Physics and Math, Abu Hassan was living in Al-Nayrab refugee camp in Aleppo before he left the country to seek asylum in Germany.



This achievement comes shortly after a similar one by "Fuad Abu Sameer" 27-years-old who managed to join "Desy" one of the most important researches centers in Germany specialized in technical and electronic development.

Palestine Charity Association in Khan Eshieh camp in Damascus countryside managed to remove and clean up the remnants of the bombing that targeted former "Beersheba" School of UNRWA as part of the ongoing efforts to alleviate the suffering of the people in the camp.

Khan Eshieh Camp is being bombed repeatedly, while all the roads connecting to neighboring areas are still closed, what drives people to risk their lives and take the road (Zakya - Wormwood Khan) despite the possibility of being targeted with heavy machine guns.

Palestinians of Syria in numbers and statistics Until 5 march 2016

- 15,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan,
- 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.
- More than 71,200 Palestinian Syrian refugees have arrived Europe until the end of December 2015.
- The Yarmouk Camp: still under siege imposed by the Syrian Regime's Army and PFLP-GC (Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command), continued for 994 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 1047 days, water cut for 544 days. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 186 victims.
- Al Sbeina Camp: Syrian Regime's Army still preventing the residents from returning back to their houses for 850 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: All of its residents have left the camp for 1042 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: Running water cut continues for 704 days, and 70% of its buildings were destroyed.
- Jarmana, AL-Saieda Zainab, Al-Raml, Al-Aedein Homs and Al-Aedein Hama: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al-Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia-Khan EShieh road.
