"Palestinian Families Displaced from Jilin Facing Dire Conditions"

Victims

Palestinian refugee Yahya Hulwa, from the Palestine Liberation Army (PLA) died as he fought alongside the government troops in clashes with the opposition outfits in Adra, in Rif Dimashq province.

202 PLA conscripts died since the outburst of the Syrian warfare, according to AGPS data.

Several Palestinian refugees fled war-ragged Syria for fear of being kidnapped at government checkpoints and forced to join PLA as military conscripts.



Latest Developments

Dozens of Palestinian families displaced from Jilin, in southern Syria, have been enduring abject conditions due to the simmering hostilities between ISIS mobs and the opposition squads.

Jilin residents have also run out of much-needed food items and medicines due to the tough cordon enforced on the area.



Last week, dozens of Palestinian and Syrian families sheltered in Yarmouk Basin, in Deraa's western outskirts, fled the area for fear of being killed in the simmering hostilities between ISIS militias and the opposition outfits.

Most of those displaced from the area have sought refuge in Yarmouk River while others headed to AlMuzeireeb, Zizoun, and Amouriya after they fled ISIS-led zones.



Located 25 kilometers away from northwestern Deraa city center, Jilin is home to 500 families, mostly displaced from Palestinian territories occupied in 1948. A number of other families are from the occupied West Bank and the blockaded Gaza Strip. Tseil town, northwest of Deraa, provides provisional refuge to some 120 Palestinian families.

Meanwhile, Yarmouk Camp and AlTadhamun area were struck with artillery shells on Saturday. The onslaught targeted Haifa, Safouriya, and Loubiya neighborhoods.



PLA groups, among other pro-government battalions, were reportedly responsible for the offensive.

Residential neighborhoods in Yarmouk Camp were also targeted with sniper bullets in the process.

At the same time, violent clashes flared up at the municipality crossroads in Palestine Street between the government patrols and AlKara'ine anti-government battalion. The clashes stretched to AlSpourat Street and AlAmeen Oven, in AlTadhamun quarter.

Bloody clashes with ISIS further hit AlHajar AlAswad, south of Yarmouk.

According to local sources, a sniper from Tahrir AlSham Commission shot an ISIS fighter on the main access road to Yarmouk, near AlShuhadaa Square.

A tough blockade has been slapped on Yarmouk Camp by the regime army and the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine – General Command for 1,353 days running. ISIS militias have also grabbed hold of large areas of the camp since early April 2015.

3,000 to 5,000 civilians have been taking refuge in Yarmouk Camp.

In a related development, residents of AlSebeina Camp for Palestinian refugees in Rural Damascus have been denied access to their homes via government-run checkpoints for 1,207 consecutive days.

Bloody hostilities between the government troops and the opposition battalions in and around AlSbeina forced dozens of families to seek



shelter elsewhere. The clashes culminated in a tighter cordon by the regime squads on all corners of the shelter.

According to eye-witnesses, 80% of AlSbeina buildings have been subjected to partial or total destruction, particularly in the area stretching from Muadh Ibn Jabal Mosque to the Kurds Oven, which makes the western entrance to the shelter.

High rates of unemployment and the lack of financial resources have added insult to injury for AlSbeina displaced community.

AlSbeina residents appealed to the Syrian regime army and its war accomplices to allow them a safe access into their homes, as was the case with the residents of AlHusseiniya Camp.

Palestinians of Syria: March 5, 2017 Statistics:

- *At least 3,454 Palestinians, including 455 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*
- *1,170 Palestinian refugees, including 83 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*
- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,353 days in a row.*
- *190 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.*
- *Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,058 and 866 days.*

- *Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,402 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 136 days.*

- *31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.*
