Daily report on the situation of Palestinian refugees in Syria



"Member of Palestinian Liberation Army dies in Syria, raising its death toll to 237 victims"

- ISIS's violations force the residents of Yarmouk camp to stay in their houses
- The flour crisis in Deraa city aggravates the suffering of the Palestinians
- "Khair Umma" Foundation distributes its aid to the Palestinians in south Turkey



## **Latest Developments**

Palestinian man "Zakaria Sawan" from the Khan Danon camp for Palestinian refugees in the suburbs of Damascus, and a recruit in the ranks of the Palestinian Liberation Army, has died while fighting alongside the Syrian regime forces.



On its part, AGPS's Monitoring and Documentation Team has confirmed that the death toll of the Palestinian recruits in the Palestinian Liberation Army, who have died since the beginning of the war in Syria, has risen to 237 victims, noting that most of them died during the clashes that broke out in different areas across Syria, mostly in the suburbs of Damascus.

In the meantime, our correspondent in Yarmouk camp for Palestinian refugees in Damascus confirmed that the streets of Yarmouk camp became almost free of passers-by throughout the day. The remaining residents of the camp prefer to stay at home than leaving their houses, because they are afraid of the violations ISIS practices against them as they cross the checkpoints that are spread across the camp.

According to the residents, ISIS intervenes in the most accurate details of their lives, from their clothing, appearances and movement to the views expressed by them and their own ideas. If



the members of ISIS are disturbed by any person, they are charged with a number of counts, some of which may lead to their execution, similar to what happened with the Palestinian refugee "Moussa Al-Badawi" who was executed in front of the Palestine Mosque for spying with Hayat Tahrir Al-Sham. The Palestinian refugee "Mohammed Attia," known as Hamouda Jezira, was executed for spying with Aknaf Beit Al-Maqdes, as well as the refugee Mohammed Nassar, a person from the Alyan family, another from the Tayha family and two other refugees from the ranks of Hayat Tahrir Al-Sham, were executed for different accusations. The refugee "Mohammed Al-Tayeh" was also executed for spying for Hayat Tahrir Al-Sham.

On their part, the residents of south Syria and the Palestinian refugees in it are suffering from a flour crisis, where their breadth is exacerbated by the lack of bread, because of the low amounts of flour provided to the stoves.

A stove owner said that the amount of flour received declined significantly, which is not enough for the people and the displaced from their areas because of the war, adding that the stoves distribute the bread three days a week, which adversely affected the citizens in the province of Deraa.

While one of the refugees said that the head of a family sleeps and wakes up to look for a loaf of bread to feed his family, noting that there is what is known as 'tourism bread', however the high prices and lack of financial sources prevented them from buying it, in



addition to the spread of unemployment and the deterioration of the security conditions and the bombardment of their areas.

The lack of fuel and heating materials, as well as the loss of many food items, and the prices of other materials increased significantly in the province of Deraa, in addition to the repeated bombardment by the Syrian regime and the constant threat posed by ISIS and its attempts to advance at the expense of the opposition.

In south Turkey, the Khair Umma Foundation distributed food baskets to the Palestinian refugees in the areas of Mersin, Adana, Ottoman, Reyhanlı, Antakya and İskenderun. In addition, it distributed children's clothes to the 70 orphans in the area.

The Palestinian refugees displaced from Syria and Iraq to Turkey are estimated at 9 thousand Palestinian refugees, most of which are living in tough conditions and are suffering from the lack of work opportunities and low salaries.

## Palestinians of Syria: March 05, 2018 Statistics:

- The total number of victims documented by the Action Group is 3665, including 465 women
- 1672 Palestinians are locked up behind Syrian government's bars, 106 of which are women
- Yarmouk refugee camp is under the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine's siege for 1,691 days in a row
- 205 refugees, mainly in Yarmouk Camp, have died due to lack of medical care and malnutrition
- Water supplies have been cut off Deraa Camp for 1427 days, and 167 days in Yarmouk Camp
- The Regime army has been in control of Handarat camp for more than 522 days. More than 80% of its buildings have been completely or partially destroyed.
- Approximately 85 thousand Palestinian-Syrian refugees fled to Europe by the end of 2016
- 31 thousand refugees are located in Lebanon
- 17 thousand refugees are sheltered in Jordan
- 6 thousand refugees are in Egypt
- 8 thousand refugees are staying in Turkey
- One thousand refugees are present in Gaza
