Latest Developments

AGPS documented the death of six Palestinian refugees from Syria in February 2019.

The list includes five refugees who were tortured to death in Syrian government prisons and another who drowned at sea.



Meanwhile, Palestinian refugee Ghassan Ezzet AlBreiki has been mysteriously held in Syrian state jails for the third consecutive year.

A resident of AlMuzeireeb town, Ghassan was arrested by the government forces in Daraa on September 25, 2016.

According to AGPS data, 1,730 Palestinian refugees continue to face mysterious conditions in Syrian government jails, among them 108 women and girls.

In another development, the Community Development Center in Jaramana camp for Palestinian refugees announced the launch of sign language courses for deaf and dumb people who yearn for



better communication and social integration. Concerned learners will be reportedly transferred by UNRWA to Damascus Society for the Deaf.

A member of the Community Development Center said UNRWA will cover all expenses of the projected course for those aged 14 and above.

Those who wish to join the course should show up at center's headquarters in Jaramana from 9 am to 3 pm.

In the meantime, the Palestinian embassy in Damascus honored on Sunday, March 3, a number of Palestinian and Syrian artists who have spoken up for the Palestinian cause. Palestine's Ambassador and a number of artists and diplomats were in attendance.



Member of Fatah's Central Committee Samir AlRefa'i, Palestine's Ambassador Mahmoud AlKhalidi, and Director-General of the Political Department of the Palestine Liberation Organization,



Ambassador Anwar Abdul Hadi, handed over the Grand Star award for arts, science, and culture to Syrian actor Duraid Laham and film directors Najda Anzor and Basel AlKhatib. Actors Ayman Zaidan, Salma AlMesri, Abed Fahd, Shukran Murtaja, and Wafa Sultan received the Excellence and Glamour badge of honor.

Along the same line, 32 Palestinian artists joined an art exhibition organized by the Democratic Front for the Liberation of Palestine (DFLP), in cooperation with the General Federation of Palestinian Visual Artists.

The event was staged on Monday, March 4, at the Arab Cultural Center in Abu Rummaneh in Damascus on the occasion of the 50th anniversary of the DFLP's founding.

The displayed paintings revealed Palestinians' commitment to their right of return to their homeland and to defend the prisoners' cause.
