"ISIS Arrests a PLA Soldier North of Tadmur"



- Three Refugees Died in Syria, two in Gouta and one in Yarmouk
- Clashes and Bombing between ISIS and AL Nusra in Yarmouk
- Helicopters Raid on the Outskirts of Khan Al Shieh Camp

Victims

The two Palestinian refugees, Ahmed Sha'ban Shehada from Al Sbeina camp and Ahmed Yousid Nassar who were fighting alongside the Syrian Regime, died during clashes with the Opposition Military Groups in Eastern Gouta in Damascus Suburb.

The Palestinian refugee Mahmoud Omar Easa, a fighter of the Vanguard of the Popular Liberation War (Al Saiqa Forces) died during clashes in the Yarmouk camp between the Syrian Army alongside the Palestinian Factions and Al Nusra Front. As a result, the number of the Palestinian refugee victims, who died while fighting alongside the Syrian Regime forces, has reached 409 out of the total toll of 3219 victims, according to the AGPS documented statics.



Recent Updates

ISIS arrested the Palestinian Refugee Bara' Zuheer Abu Edrees, a PLA soldier, during clashes that broke out between the Regular Army alongside the PLA and ISIS north east of Tadmur city. It is referred that the PLA military service is compulsory to the Palestinian refugees in



Syria which forced many youth to refuse join the service during the ongoing war in Syria, and preferred to travel to the surrounding countries.



Turning to the South of the Syrian capital, Damascus, violent clashes and mutual sniping broke out in the Yarmouk camp for Palestinian Refugees between ISIS and AL Nusra front.

A resident reported to the AGPS that sporadic clashes broke out between the two parts using light weapons and mortar shells. The AGPS correspondent reported casualties among the two parts, in addition to burning some houses in Safad Street. On the other hand, dozens of families, who are trapped in their houses due to clashes, are still suffer from difficult living situation due to the unavailability of food, medicine and water. Meanwhile, the Yarmouk camp, which is besieged by the Regular Army since mid-2013, is suffering from a sharp shortage of food materials and medicines which caused the death of 187 refugees.

The population has declined due to the fighting in Yarmouk camp from 220000, before the Syrian MIG Warplanes shelling at the end of



December 2012, to about 18000 and then to 6000 after the invasion of ISIS to the camp in 1/4/2015.



In a different context, the Syrian warplanes launched a number of raids on the outskirts of Khan Al Shieh camp western of Damascus where the warplanes targeted Al Salam highway, Al Villat Street, and Al Qusour area, which led to a panic state among the residents of the camp specially children fearing to be targeted.

The Events in Khan AL Shieh came in a time that the Regular Army continues to cut all roads connecting the camp with Damascus center, which led to increase the living situation and losing many medicine and food items and raising the prices of others.





Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics till 05/05/2016:

- *15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan*
- *42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon*
- *6000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015*
- *8000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Turkey*
- *1000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza*
- *More than 71.2 thousand Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till the End of December 2015*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1055 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1116 days, water was cut for 605 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 909 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - All Residents have left the camp for about 1100 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 762 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jermana, AL Saieda ZAINAB, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.*
