Victims

Palestinian refugee Nabil Joud, a resident of Khan Dannoun Camp, was killed in the rampant hostilities rocking Daraa province, south of Syria.

AGPS kept record of the death of 3,507 Palestinian refugees since the outburst of Syria's warfare.



Latest Developments

A thorough report documenting the situation of the Palestinians of Syria was released by AGPS under the title: "Palestinians of Syria and the Road to Europe: A Journey of Pain and Hope".

The report sheds light on the forced deportation of the Palestinians of Syria to Europe and the deadly risks encountered on the migration road.

The study outlines the geographical distribution of Palestinians from Syria across the European continent in the hunt for a safer shelter.

According to statistics by the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees, 80,000 Palestinians from Syria reached Europe until the end of 2016.



AGPS report also examines the popular and official positions adopted by European states as regards the refugee influx along with the legal and humanitarian situations endured by the Palestinian refugee community from Syria in Europe.

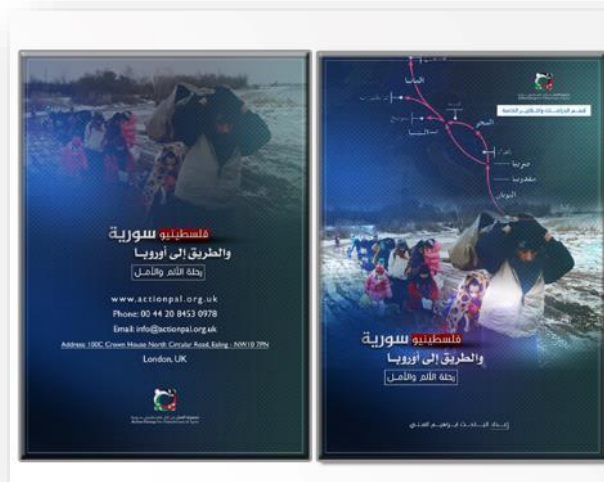
It further spotlights the success stories achieved by a number of Palestinian youths from Syria in the cultural, scientific, and sports fields.

As figures in the report, AGPS documented the death of 96 Palestinian refugees on way to Europe during the period between July 2012 and April 2017.

The data backing up the report had been amassed by a group of on-the-sport reporters, field observers, and professional journalists.

In another development, Daraa Camp for Palestinian refugees and its environs were struck with ground-to-ground missiles and barrel bombs.

AGPS news correspondent said over the past couple of days the camp had come under heavy shelling. The government forces targeted the camp and its vicinities with 43 surface-to-surface missiles and 12 barrel bombs, resulting in heavy material damage.

At the same time, clashes have been ongoing since the early morning hours between the Syrian government forces and the opposition outfits using heavy and medium weapons.

Over the past couple of weeks, the Syrian regime army has stepped up military offensives on Daraa province in an attempt to grab hold of the area and force the opposition fighters to retreat to the northern Syrian province of Idlib.

Meanwhile, a round of mortar shells slammed into Yarmouk Camp for Palestinian refugees.

A couple of days earlier, the regime forces attacked Palestine Street and Sports Street with mortar shells and B10 artillery, inflicting heavy material losses.

A tough cordon has been imposed by the regime army and its war partners on the camp for 1,000 days running, blocking civilians' access out of and into the shelter. Water supplies to the camp have also been cut off since September 8, 2014. All hospitals and clinics in the area have gone out of operation and several medics were pronounced dead in the unabated hostilities.



Several relief institutions also suspended their services after ISIS crept into the camp, in cooperation with AlNusra Front, in early April 2015.

In the meantime, ISIS and Tahrir AlSham battalions have reportedly been gearing up to retreat from the camp after Tahrir AlSham fighters were allowed a safe access into Idlib as part of the four-town agreement between the Syrian government and the opposition.



Meanwhile, Palestinian refugee Wadah Mahmoud Hussein, from Khan AlSheih Camp, was released from Syrian government jails.

Hussein, a greengrocer in Khan AlSheih, was arrested at the government-run Baghdad checkpoint in Damascus on June 1, 2017.

On Sunday, three Palestinian students—Nizar Sa'id AlNader, Mahmoud Jamil Noufel, and Ahmed Mahmoud Ibrahim—sheltered in Khan AlSheih Camp were kidnapped by the government forces on their way to Artouz to take final exams.



Palestinians of Syria: June 5, 2017 Statistics:

- *At least 3,507 Palestinians, including 462 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*
- *1,603 Palestinian refugees, including 99 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*
- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,414 days in a row.*
- *196 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.*
- *Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,149 and 1,000 days.*
- *Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,493 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 227 days.*
- *Nearly 85,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until the end of 2016.*
- *31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.*
- *17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.*
- *6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.*
- *8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.*
- *1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.*
